## **ELDERS' COMMENTS**

Whether it is preparing Thanksgiving boxes for others, cooking and providing food for luncheons, or for families who need it, you spend time and money in doing it. You visit, write cards, make phone calls, entertain guests, teach Bible classes, run errands, provide transportation, represent Tara at Gospel meetings and ladies' days, prepare the communion, and the list could be continued. Ladies, you are important to the Lord's work, and we love and appreciate you.

## THE ANCHOR OF THE SOUL

The Christian's hope is described in Scripture as "an anchor of the soul, both sure and steadfast..." (Heb. 6:19) This figure does not occur elsewhere in the Bible, but in the Greek and Roman classics, and also on the ancient coins, an anchor was often used as an emblem of hope. With a ship, the storm may rage and the billows may rise like mountains, but so long as the anchor holds, the ship rides the troubled waters triumphantly and so it is with the faithful Christian. The storms of life often rage about us with frightening intensity, but as long as our hope in the Lord is both "sure and steadfast." We can remain perfectly secure. However, when hope is gone, we become like the ship driven out to sea, or onto the rocks, by a raging tempest.

Many face sicknesses and adversities with no hope. It is always difficult to accept the tragedies of life when we know there is no hope. But people do it everyday through terminal illnesses, or becoming hopelessly lost at sea, or in a blizzard on a mountain climb. We all realize that we must die some day, but when death is inevitable, all we can do is be thankful for the life we have for heaven. But sadly, most people die with no hope. The greatest of all tragedies is to leave this world with no hope. Our only hope is in Christ. (Col. 1:27) Yet, the vast majority of the earth's billions die out of Christ. One of the saddest descriptions of lost people in the Bible is found in Ephesians 2:12. "...that at the time you were without Christ... having no hope and without God in the world." But then notice, in the very next verse, the comforting words to those in Christ... "But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ." In Christ there is hope; out of Christ there is no hope.

Physical hope often is beyond our control. Nothing or no one can give us hope in some circumstances. All we can do is accept the inevitable. But in the spiritual realm there can be hope if we want it. The great Physician can heal our spiritual diseases. Hope is offered and provided if man will just accept it. We get into Christ through our obedient faith. (Gal. 3: 26,27) We stay in Christ though our obedient faith. (Rev. 2:10) Then when death comes, our hope will sustain us. (II Tim. 4:6-8)

Will your anchor hold in the storms of life, When the clouds unfold their wings of strife? When the strong tides lift, and the cables strain, Will your anchor drift, or firm remain?

We have an anchor that keeps the soul Steadfast and sure while the billows roll, Fastened to the Rock which cannot move, Grounded firm and deep in the Savior's love.
