Are you studying the Bible more? Is prayer becoming more important to your daily life? Has your attendance of the regularly scheduled assemblies of the church improved any? Are you inviting more people to visit with us? Have you started selecting tracts from the foyer table to give to friends and family members? Do you have more of a positive attitude about Tara, and are you finding ways to help the church grow? Are you reaching out to help someone who needs care? Is greeting visitors and other members each Sunday your regular practice? Doing more in 2024, or anytime, is a personal decision, followed by action.

GROWING OLDER IN CHRIST

Have you noticed that we are growing older? Of course you have. Everything that lives is getting older. That's the nature of things and people. You see signs of it everywhere - at the mall, at the doctor's office, in the church, and even on the college campus. But isn't it a blessing to grow older, rather than the alternative. As you grow older you realize that age is relative. You look at it differently. When you are a child, thirty is old. But at thirty, sixty is old. Learn more about what could help your health, your financial situation, your family, your occupation, and your outlook on life. "They shall still bear fruit in old age; they shall be fresh and flourishing." (Psalm 92:14)

Never stop your social growth. Make new friends. Speak to people you see when you are out. Introduce yourself and start a conversation while waiting to see the doctor, get your car repaired, or whenever the opportunity is good. Get to know your neighbors. Show genuine interest in people. Remember their names. Ask about their family, occupation, recreation, etc. and tell them about yours. Don't stay in your own little world with no desire to get to know more and more people. Also, keep the bond of friendships strong and vibrant. Find things to do together that strengthens your relationship. Be there for them when there is a need. "A man who has friends must himself be friendly, but there is a friend who sticks closer than a brother." (Proverbs 18:24)

Never stop your spiritual growth. Deepen your love for the Lord by reading and studying the Bible more, praying more often and more fervently, and realizing your need for Him in your daily life. Your faith will grow stronger, your heart purer and your hope brighter. Deepen your love for the Lord's people. Do things together, share your joys and sorrows, draw strength from them and always be ready to give it back. Deepen your love for the Lord's work. He wants the lost to be saved; so should we.
