Elders' Comment's

Pain, suffering and adversity happen to most of us sometime in life. Whether it be a serious accident, a battle with disease, overcoming extensive surgery, or just old age with it's aches and pains, most everyone suffers pain sooner or later. How we deal with it makes a big difference in our daily lives. Someone has written, "God does not allow us to have trials to make us bitter, but better; not to impair us, but to improve us, not for confinement, but for refinement". It was Paul who wrote, "We rejoice in our sufferings, because we know that suffering produces perseverance, and perseverance, character, and character, hope." (Rom. 5:3,4). May we depend on the Lord to bless us during times of adversity.

COMMITMENT IN CHRISTIAN LIVING

In Paul's letters to the churches, it was customary for him to greet some individuals personally, as well as to mention his traveling companions. Among those mentioned in II Timothy 4:10-12 are Demas, Mark and Luke. When he wrote this letter, Paul was in prision in Rome, anticipating his own death. He refers to these three men as to their relationship with him.

Demas - He writes, "Demas has forsaken me, having loved this present world." Demas apparently had been a faithful companion earlier. He is named in Col.4:14 and is described as a "fellow laborer" in Phile. 24. When Paul needed Demas the most, he had forsaken him. How sad it is when a follower of Christ forsakes the greatest cause on earth. In forsaking Paul and his work, Demas had forsaken the Lord. Why would a Christian give up the faith and go back into the world? Many do it today. Some who have been faithful for years, and involved in various areas of church work, have left the church for the world.

That's why we should heed the exhortation, "Do not love the world, or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world - the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life - is not of the Father but is of the world. And the world is passing away, and the lust of it, but he who does the will of God abides forever." (I John 2:15-17) Demas is an example of the person who is so influenced by the world that he finally leaves the Lord and his church. Do you know someone like Demas?

Mark - The imprisoned apostle's request of Timothy was, "Get Mark and bring him with you, for he is useful to me for ministry." (II Tim.4:11) Mark, also called John, had begun with Paul on his first missionary journey, but for some reason, not acceptable to Paul, he had turned back. This led Paul to refuse to take Mark on his second journey. (Acts 13:5,13; 15:36-41) But now, years later, Mark has redeemed himself in Paul's eyes, and the apostle considers him to be a profitable minister. We have people in the church today like Mark. They are committed and dependable for awhile, and then for some reason, they turn back. They may go through a period of inactivity because of their job, family circumstances, or they just lose interest. Their interest seems to be elsewhere, rather than in the Lord's work. Some even fall away for a period of time. However, before it is too late, they are restored, and once again become active, faithful servants of Christ. They prove themselves to be reliable, dependable and useful in the Lord's work. Do you know anyone like Mark?

Luke - In verse 11 Paul writes, "Only Luke is with me." Luke, the beloved physician, had ever been faithful to the apostle and to God. He had not forsaken Paul as had Demas. It had not been necessary for him to prove himself after a period of unreliability as had Mark. He was always there when needed. There are many in the church like Luke, who having begun the Christian race, never turn back, but are always faithful until death. Do you know anyone like Luke? Are you like him?
