PRACTICAL CHRISTIANITY Practicing Friendliness



Every normal person needs encouragement during trying circumstances of life. It is needed in the home as husbands and wives encourage each other, or as parents encourage their children. Good teachers find opportunities to encourage their students who may be struggling in some area of their work. It is not uncommon to hear encouraging words from one's employer, or from fellow employees. Any worthwhile pursuit finds the need to receive, or to give, encouragement.

Since our relationship with Christ, and with Christians, is a lifelong pursuit, the opportunity to encourage others, or to be encouraged, is repeatedly available. What a ministry one could fulfill by working at being an encourager. Think about the personal rewards to be received in knowing you have helped someone by just a few thoughtful words. Solomon wrote, "*A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold in settings of silver*" (Prov.25:11) Again, "*....a word spoken in due season, how good it is!*" (Prov.15:23b)

The word *encourage*, or *encouragement*, means "to inspire with courage"; "to give confidence"; "to stimulate, or stir up". This can be done by the words we use, as well as by our example. Someone says, "Well, if he can do it, I believe I can too". "*And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, but exhorting one another....*" (Heb.10:24,25) The word, *exhort*, is a little stronger word than *encourage*. It means "to urge earnestly"; or "to admonish strongly to do what is proper, or required". Now, who does the *stirring up*, and *exhorting* (encouraging)? One another! Everybody in the church is needed in giving encouragement to others. Consider a few areas where you can be an encourager.

Send a card to the sick, shut in, bereaved or discouraged, letting them know they are in your thoughts and prayers. **Visit** them with the intentions of giving encouragement. **Use** your telephone to encourage others. **Lend** a helping hand without expecting something in return, or seeking recognition. **Ask** someone to go with you, or help you in a project that is for the purpose of encouraging another. Three people then will be encouraged by the same deed. **Commend** someone for the good job they did in some particular work. **Point** out the positive attributes one has that is a strength to the church. **Emphasize** what one's leadership, or example, means to you personally. **Pray** for the discouraged each day, and then tell them you are praying for them.

Brethren, God has given us the means whereby we can encourage others in every good work. We just need to use what we have to build up, edify and encourage. "*The Lord has given me the tongue of the learned, that I should know how to speak a word in season to him who is weary...*" (Isa.50:4) "*Let us pursue the things which make for peace, and the things by which one may edify another*". (Rom.14:19)
