SPIRITUAL HEALTH



The spiritual health of the Christian depends to a great degree on faithfully attending the regular worship services of the local church. By no means is this the only criterion of determining faithfulness, yet it definitely is one. Just as our physical health is dependent upon eating the right foods with some regularity, our soul must be fed with the proper diet of teaching, exhortation and learning.

Obviously, circumstances arise that make it impossible, or most difficult, to attend a particular service. Therefore, we are not speaking of those who are too ill to attend, or whose employment may hinder their attending every service. But one who chooses not to attend because of being too tired, or too busy, or is more interested in doing some thing else, has a serious spiritual problem - a lack of love for the Lord. It's a heart problem rather than an attendance problem.

Most everyone does what he wants to do. But with few exceptions, people do not attend Sunday and Wednesday nights because they do not want to. All the pleading, coaxing and exhorting to do better falls on deaf ears with such folks. Only when it becomes important will change occur. Some go through life with irregular or sporadic attendance. They also train their children, by example, to do the same.

One of the responsibilities and privileges we have as Christians is to assemble at appointed times to worship God and encourage one another. I can find no scripture that would indicate that any assembly is optional or unimportant. Can you? Is your spiritual health important enough to assemble faithfully?
