

Some Easter Considerations

Easter is a man-made religious holiday.

So is Lent, Palm Sunday, Holy Thursday and Good Friday. Such cannot be found in the Bible, but were introduced several hundred years after the Scriptures provided man completely unto every good work. (II Timothy 3:16,17)

Jesus did not authorize its celebration.

He promised to send the Holy Spirit who would guide the apostles into "all truth: (John 16:13) None of the apostles, nor any New Testament church, ever observed it.

The gospel is the death and resurrection of Christ.

(I Corinthians 15:1-4) The first century church met weekly (not annually) to commemorate Christ's death by observing the Lord's supper. (Acts 20:7, I Corinthians 11:23-26) The resurrection is a biblical fact for which we are constantly thankful, and by which we have hope for our own resurrection.

Scripture condemns special religious days.

The issue is addressed in principle in Galatians 4:10,11 and Colossians 2:16,17. The Bible gives instructions on when and how the Lord's resurrection is to be observed.

• We must follow the Scriptures in all things.

We are Christ's disciples if we abide in His word. (John 8:31) We cannot add to the scriptures. (II John 9; Revelation 22:18) Observing human traditions, even those that appear good and right, is dangerous. (Mark 7:1-13)

The Value Of Self-**Examination**



One could never estimate the value of self-examination, physically or spiritually. The medical profession encourages it in order to detect possible cancer growths. Lives have been saved because some serious physical condition was caught in time. Marriages have been saved because couples have been willing to look within themselves, rather than at each other, for some solutions to marital problems. Who knows how many have avoided losing their jobs because they saw areas where they could do better as employees. Self examination, followed by personal improvement, very often has been profitable as employees. Self examination, followed by personal improvement, very often has been the determining factor in the promotion of better living.

It should be no surprise that self-examination is essential in Christian living also. "Examine yourselves as to whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Do you not know yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you?-Unless indeed you are disqualified" (2 Corinthians 13:5). In his earlier epistle to Corinth Paul had written, "Therefore whoever eats this bread or drinks this cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord. But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup..."(I Corinthians11:27,28).

By examining others, rather than ourselves, sometimes we ask the wrong questions. Instead of "What is the congregation doing for me?" would it not be better to ask, "What am I doing for this congregation? Instead of "Why aren't they more friendly?" it should be, "How friendly am I?" Instead of "Why don't I get more out of the worship?" we should ask, "What do I put into the worship?" Instead of "Why doesn't the preaching satisfy me?" we should ask, "Would any preacher satisfy everyone?" "Did Jesus?" Instead of "Why isn't the church doing more?" we should ask," What am I doing?" Let each of us do a better job at selfexamination. After all, it could save our soul if it is caught in time.
