

WHEN SHOULD WE COMPROMISE?

There are many areas of life in which compromise becomes a logical and loving way of dealing with differences. Compromise can show respect and consideration. Husbands and wives can compromise on where they will eat, shop, take a vacation, buy a car, etc. They usually can compromise on where they will sleep, but not with whom. Parents and children often need to compromise, but sometimes it would be wrong to do so. When children are in danger, parents cannot afford to compromise with them.

Compromise should always be in areas where no one will be hurt by it. Did you hear the story of the hunter and the bear? While hunting for bear one morning, the hunter noticed one coming out of the brush, walking in his direction. As he raised his rifle, the bear said, "Can't we talk this over?" Lowering his gun, the hunter asked, "What's there to talk about?" "Well", said the bear, coming closer, "What do you want me for?" "Simple", said the hunter, "I want a fur coat". "All I want is a good breakfast", said the bear, "I am sure we can talk about this and reach an agreement". So they sat down to work out a solution. Shortly, the bear began to walk away. They had reached a compromise. The bear had eaten his breakfast, and the hunter was in a fur coat. Compromise just will not work with bears, nor will it work with some people, or with some situations in life.

As Christians, we cannot afford to compromise with sin. A compromise of principles of decency, honesty and integrity has ruined many lives, brought reproach upon the church, and possibly caused souls to be lost eternally. Many today are trying to compromise the truth in the name of brotherly love and unity. "Let's just agree to disagree". Unity in diversity seems to be the answer for many people. But what does the Bible teach? "Stand fast in the faith"... (I Cor.16:13); "contend earnestly for the faith..." (Jude 3); "continue in the faith, grounded and steadfast, and not moved away from the hope of the gospel..." (Col.1:23) and scores of other admonitions do not allow compromise of the truth.

Many congregations are suffering today because of the sin of compromise. We hear of elders and preachers that are leading God's people into apostasy through compromise. Pressure to change the worship to be more appealing and entertaining may come from liberal elements in the congregation, but to avoid division, compromise often is forced upon leaders who know better. Very often, the leaders themselves instigate the innovations. (Acts 20:30) We can often get what we want by compromise, but is what we get what God wants? In matters of opinion, judgment and expediency, compromise is often the best thing to do. In doctrinal matters, however, compromise will lead us right into the hands of the devil.
