From the Pen of Richard

WHILE IT IS DAY

Late in Jesus' earthly ministry he said to his disciples, "I must work the works of Him who sent me while it is day; the night is coming when no one can work". (John 9:4) It was about six months after this that the Lord was crucified. It is likely that the day was declining, and with night coming on, he took the occasion to introduce these thought-provoking words. He simply meant that it was urgent that he do the work the Father sent him to do while life lasted. What an important lesson this is for all who follow Him. What can we learn from it?

The night is coming for everyone. Life is so short, regardless of one's age. Small babies in their mother's arms are experiencing the beginning of their day, while teens and young adults are at mid morning. The thirty somethings are quickly approaching noon, just as the forties and fifties are at mid afternoon. In our sixties and seventies we watch the setting of the sun and the rapid approach of the night. The time to work is now, while it is day, because the night is coming.

We have a work to do. Every Christian is to be a 'worker for the Lord." We sing it; we preach it; we support it with our time and money; we pray that God will bless our work for Him. We are exhorted to be "fruitful in every good work' (Col. 1:10), and be 'always abounding in the work of the Lord" (I Cor. 15:58) How often do we waste time that could be given in the Lord's service? Our work as parents is to bring up our children in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. (Eph. 6:4) Young people are exhorted, "Let no one despise your youth, but be an example to the believers in word, in conduct, in love, in spirit, in faith, in purity." (I Tim. 4:12) Older men and women are commanded to be examples and teachers of the young. (Titus 2:1-5) And we all are to work at bringing the lost to Christ. Jesus said, "The harvest truly is plentiful, but the laborers are few" (Matt. 9:37)

The Lord has sent us to work. After His resurrection Jesus said, "As the Father has sent me, I also sent you." (John 20:21) He has sent us to teach the lost, to edify and admonish the saved, to feed the hungry and cloth the naked, to visit the fatherless and widows, to warn the unruly, to comfort the faith hearted and to uphold the weak. It was the Lord who said, "Go", and while it is day, we go because He has sent, and the night is coming.
