CASTING BEHIND OUR BACK

"Casting behind our back" is a figure of speech meaning that something is forgotten. It's in the past, it's over; we put it behind us and move forward from now on. There are some things that need to be cast behind our back, such as mistakes and failures of the past. You cannot erase mistakes made in the past, but you can and must not dwell on them. We must "forget the things that are behind, and reach forth to the things that are ahead". ((Phil.3:13) We must "put our hand to the plow and not look back". (Luke 9:62) However, let us consider what we must never cast behind our back.

We must not cast God behind our back. The kingdom of Israel divided because of a rebellious leadership who forgot God and led the people to forget him. God said of Jereboam, ".....you have gone and made for yourself other gods and molded images to provoke me to anger, and have cast me behind your back" (I Kings 14:9) Not only did Jereboam cast God behind his back, but he caused the people to do the same thing. They followed him into idolatry. Whether as a leader, or a follower, we must never cast God behind our back. God through Jeremiah pled with his rebellious people to "ask for the old paths, where the good way is, and walk in it; Then you will find rest for your souls. But they said, we will not walk in it". (Jer.6:16) This resulted in seventy years of captivity. Later, God through Ezekiel made it very plain to the Babylonian captives, "Because you have forgotten me and cast me behind your back, therefore you shall bear the penalty of your lewdness and your harlotry". (Eze.23:35) This is a lesson for God's people who make up the church today. When we forget him, casting him behind our back, we will suffer the consequences....and they are eternal.

We must not cast God's Word behind our back. When the captives were allowed freedom to return to their homeland, the Levites led the people in glorious praises to God, but they were reminded also of their history of disobedience in casting God's law behind their back. "Nevertheless they were disobedient and rebelled against you, cast your law behind their backs, and killed your prophets, who testified against them...." (Neh.9:26) When one casts God behind his back, he does the same to God's word. "Seeing you hate instruction and cast my words behind you". (Ps.50:17) Are we often guilty of doing the same thing with God's word? We are when we have no time, nor interest, in studying it. (II Tim.2:15) We are when we will not listen to it. (Matt.13:15) We are when we are hearers and not doers. (James 1:22) We are when we refuse to obey him. (Matt.7:21) It is sad to see people who have served the Lord faithfully in the past, but because of sin, carelessness, doctrinal error, or whatever, they have turned their back on God, his word and his church. Let us be cautious that we never cast God, nor his word, behind our back. Rather, let us humbly study his word, obey it, and reverently submit our lives to him and his cause in the time we have left. It will be eternally worth the effort
