If the ECHS has identified and implemented sustainability structures to address and minimize the challenges of staff turnover, please describe those structures here.

When staff are initially hired, we will look for those who want to remain here long term and that are willing to buy into the campus mission and vision. They have to understand and support the unique things that we want to do to try to make sure all students are successful.

We will attempt to retain staff by providing a supportive and collaborative culture while challenging them to improve each year. We will schedule regular meetings with staff often to get their input and we will truly value their opinions. Establishing two way trust will allow for all parties involved to do what is best for students.

We have already had preliminary discussions with our IHE partner, the Tarrant County College Southeast Campus. They intend to partner with our staff by inviting them to participate in learning sessions, giving them opportunities to collaborate with their staff, and by providing resources as needed. If possible, we will let faculty teach a different course each year in their discipline so they can grow as professionals and also so they can get a better understanding of the overall academic sequence of courses. We also plan on giving them opportunities to observe college courses that students will take as juniors and seniors. This will help them prepare our freshman and sophomores for what lies ahead.

During our opening year, the main focus will be on establishing a culture that makes staff feel valued and eager to go to work. With the right supports, our goal will be that staff want to remain here for the long term because it is a rewarding experience that is not available anywhere else.

Describe the processes that the dual credit provider and the ECHS campuses monitor student progress, and determine when interventions are needed. How is this ECHS going to share data and monitor student progress and ensure student success?

Each week, we will have all students do grade checks for their high school and college courses.

Teachers

and the counselor will monitor this process and chart how each individual student is doing. If a student has an average that drops below a 70, he or she will be assigned to an intervention session during the school day or after school. During this intervention time a teacher will work with the student(s) to help them improve their performance.

Regular parent contacts will also be made so the families are aware of how their child is progressing. Individual teachers will maintain tutorial sessions after school and during an advisory period in the middle of the day. These sessions during the day will rotate by content areas. For example, if a student is struggling

in English, he or she will visit their English teacher on Wednesdays. Counselors will hold one on one intervention discussions with students who may be struggling in order to provide academic and social-emotional supports.

Our campus and our IHE partner will share data on a regular basis. Weekly meetings will be held with our campus principal and the IHE liaison to discuss student progress. Our campus will also share student performance data at IHE academic meetings as well as leadership council meetings. We will use the data to identify particular courses that will need more student support through individual tutorials, supplemental instruction sessions, or other various methods of intervention.

The data we are able to capture will be separated by cohort and will detail such items as STAAR EOC performance, TSI performance, college hours earned, high school credits earned, grade point averages, and retention.

Through continuous communication, collaboration, and reflective practices, our campus and the IHE will be proactive to ensure students are successful throughout each step of their journey.
