Describe how the IHE articulation agreement addresses the following IHE Blueprint Requirement: Curriculum alignment and courses of study, which enables a student to combine high school courses and college-level courses to earn either an associate degree, postsecondary certificate provided by an IHE, or industry certification.

The MOU between Lonestar College and Quest ECHS provides for curriculum alignment on page 6, item 11 by describing the integrated framework that ensures a seamless transition from grade level to

grade level and proceeds through college courses, using Attachment A- Coursewalk. This course walk allows for students to enter the course of study at four different entry points, depending upon their level of rigor in middle school. Student progress is monitored by persons at both the college and high school to ensure progression through both degree plans to the point of attaining 15, 30, or 60 transferable college credits.

The MOU addresses student progress and support on page 8, item 15. This section outlines the various levels of council that are charged with monitoring satisfactory student performance and curriculum development, which are updated each semester, at minimum. The MOU describes the extraordinary steps taken to assist students who are not performing satisfactorily, including double blocked Algebra I classes, tutorials, weekly advising time, and college interventions with struggling students such as tutors and advisers from within the college system. While on the college campus, students are offered additional supports, supplemental instruction programs, and counseling. The high school provides for an additional counselor to assist and inform students and guardians.

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**Describe how the IHE articulation agreement addresses the following IHE Blueprint Requirements: Transportation costs and fees including provisions for discontinuing operation while ensuring students previously enrolled will have opportunity to complete their course of study.**

The MOU between LoneStar College and Quest ECHS addresses transportation on page 6, item 8. Transportation of students between the high school and college is provided by Humble ISD. Discontinuing of Operations is addressed on page 11, at item 25. This section provides for 90 days' notice in writing to the college president and Humble ISD superintendent in order to terminate the partnership. Since Quest has four grade levels, the discontinuing of operations is required through graduation of the current student cohorts, with no additional cohorts added.

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**Describe how the IHE articulation agreement addresses the following IHE Blueprint Requirements: Data sharing agreement that includes provisions for teacher data such as qualifications and student level data such as credit hours taken and earned, GPA, formative data to assess if student is on track for college readiness**

Data sharing is provided through bi-monthly meetings between LoneStar College leadership and Quest ECHS leadership and through annual review of data at the end of the academic year. Faculty qualifications for Quest ECHS are outlined in item 6 of the MOU and can be summarized by high school only teachers at Quest ECHS must meet state certification in the state of Texas, while dual credit teachers must meet the additional graduate hours required of community college professors, per SACS requirements. Quest ECHS teachers and staff are reviewed annually through the state appraisal system currently used through the school district. Adjuncts who come to the ECHS campus to teach dual credit must meet the same qualifications as all other professors on the college campus.

Quest ECHS recruits teachers at local job fairs, such as the annual Humble ISD job fair. Teachers at Quest ECHS who are not already able to teach dual credit are offered opportunities through the Lonestar College system and its partnerships to earn 18 graduate hours. Ensuring that teachers hired by Humble ISD also meet the rigorous standards of SACS has been challenging in certain content areas, and therefore Quest ECHS leadership discusses eligibility and requirements often with the leadership team from Lonestar College. Quest ECHS is fortunate to exist in an ISD that enjoys a great reputation in the region and which has recently adjusted its salaries to be more competitive with surrounding districts, so attracting qualified applicants has not been problematic. Making long range staffing plans and early discussions regarding staffing at budgetary meetings with Humble ISD leadership help Quest ECHS administration find the best possible teachers from the applicant pool.

Activity	Description
Family Advising	Students meet at the start of each day in "family" units which have been established since Bridge Camp at the start of 9th grade. Here connections are made that allow for whole child education, social-emotional learning, and academic support.
College and Career Readiness counseling	Individual, small group, cohort, and large group advising is provided monthly to students and their families by the College and Career Readiness Coordinator at Quest ECHS.
AVID	Quest ECHS requires every student to enroll in the AVID elective every year. This curriculum provides a variety of aspects for college success, including soft skill development, career exploration, and college exploration and preparation
Flexible time	Quest ECHS has a school day that includes 30 minutes of flexible time each day that students can use as they want. During this time students are encouraged to attend tutorials, but they may also attend club meetings, study individually or in groups, or take a brain break.
Progress Reporting	Quest ECHS publishes interval progress reports at 3 weeks and holds weekly meetings between staff and students to discuss grades, progress, and interventions.

Activity	Description
Parent and Community Involvement	Quest ECHS has a whole-school service component, which has been a part of our school since its foundation in 1995. We endeavor to include our community in as many ways as possible by sending every student into the community for service for three hours each Friday.
Parent and Community Involvement	Through our school's National Honor Societies, our school hosts a wide variety of community members, who may or may not be families of Quest students, to enrich the opportunities for our students.
Parent and Community Involvement	Our school hosts Parent Bridge Camps, Open Houses, various community events, Friday movies, an International Festival, a College Signing Extravaganza, and other events to engage our families and the community.

**How does your academy use the access, achievement, and attainment data for program improvement?**

Each month the College & Career readiness Coordinator presents staff development to Quest ECHS staff to review achievement and attainment data. After the data is presented, the Quest ECHS staff discuss "glows and grows" and has time set aside each Friday to share best practices, review additional data, and provide support and enrichment for the continuous improvement of our school and its staff and students. Also monthly our At-Risk Counselor allows time for grade level teams to identify and

remediate for struggling students and their families. Each week, students success and progress is monitored through the advisory time known as Family, a foundational component of Quest since its foundation as a high school in 1995..
