The Early College High School shall have a current, signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for each school year that defines the partnership between the school district(s) and the institution(s) of higher education (IHE).

Describe how the IHE articulation agreement addresses the following IHE Blueprint Requirement: Curriculum alignment and courses of study, which enables a student to combine high school courses and college-level courses to earn either an associate degree, postsecondary certificate provided by an IHE, or industry certification.

The Edinburg Collegiate Prep ECHS and South Texas College shall provide a course of study that enables a participating student to receive a high school diploma and either an associates degree or 60 semester hours that are transferable and applicable towards a baccalaureate degree during grades 9-12. South Texas College will give credit for those courses taken for dual credit for which Dual Credit Course Agreement have been approved with primary emphasis on the Core Curriculum requirements for all Associates of Arts and Associates of Science degrees. Edinburg Collegiate Prep ECHS students will receive an academic degree plan upon the completion of a career and program of study interest inventory. During a students senior year, or after completion of the Core Curriculum, courses of field of study programs can be completed according to College's suggestion of course sequencing. Such courses shall be evaluated and approved through the official College curriculum approval process and shall be taught at the College level..

The College and the School District shall offer comprehensive college advising services for dual credit student consisting of a First-Time Dual Credit Student Module, Group enrollment advising using Degree Works, face to face advising and College Advising Training Program for High School District Counselors. New dual credit student are required to complete a First-Time Dual Credit Student Module (FTDCSM) for eligibility into the Dual Program. The Module must be completed prior students first attempt semester. Advising responsibilities by the College and School District is to disseminate the First-Time Dual Credit Student Module information and instructions for completion to School District Counselors. This is followed by an orientation and group enrollment advising session using Degree Works for new dual credit students. Advisers are to serve as designated college support service staff for advising dual credit students. School District Counselors will verify that students have completed the First-Time Dual Credit Student Module prior to registration and provide a computer lab and schedule for group enrollment advising

Describe how the IHE articulation agreement addresses the following IHE Blueprint Requirements: Transportation costs and fees including provisions for discontinuing operation while ensuring students previously enrolled will have opportunity to complete their course of study.

The College waives student tuition for dual credit "S" section college courses, including the student advisement and library usage fees. The District will assume responsibility for the timely payment of the cost incurred to recover College expenses for faculty traveling to Edinburg Collegiate Prep ECHS. campus or for college course sections whereby a course is provided solely for Edinburg Collegiate Prep ECHS students. The School District is encouraged to hire academic Master's credentialed faculty for all high school credit only courses and future college courses to support sustainability of the Edinburg Collegiate Prep ECHS. Changes to the funding formula for either the School District or the College will be reviewed yearly to determine whether adjustments are needed. Any such adjustments will be communicated to the District during spring semester to align with the District budget process.

FERPA allows protected student data to be exchanged between the College and School District for students that are dually enrolled without the consent of either the parents or the student under (99.34). If the student is under 18, the parents still retain the right under FERPA to inspect and review any education records maintained by the School District, including records that the College disclosed. The College and the School District are expected to meet FERPA requirements to maintain the privacy of student data. The College will provide data reports to the School District via standard reports as per identified timelines. These reports have been developed in effort to provide required data in a timely manner to our partners with signed MOU. The School District shall provide a primary and secondary contact, at the district and at each high school, to receive data via secured process from the College. These contacts will be responsible for distributing data securely within their assigned area and within FERPA guidelines. Any student level data received from the College shall not be shared outside the District without prior authorization form the College. The College partners may request data outside of the scheduled report distribution schedule provided an MOU has been executed and is active between the partner organization and the College. Also, the data request is submitted at a minimum of 3 business days prior to the requested delivery date.

1. Using Professors from IHE. Edinburg Collegiate Prep has incorporated professors from South Texas College to assist in providing dual instruction for sections in which we do not have a district employee who is mastered and certified for the dual class. This has made some classes vulnerable to strict and un-flexible guidelines from certain professors. 2. Collaborate with STC to Schedule Courses that we need. Planning with our IHE has been challenging as it pertains to sections that meet the needs of our students. Time and sections have been limited making it difficult to schedule students 3. Continue Seeking Teacher with masters in areas of need. Working in a "school within a school" has developed

some challenges in finding and hiring teachers with a masters. Followed by having those teachers who are mastered be given the opportunity by the IHE to teach a dual class Edinburg Collegiate Prep along with our district and higher ed partner have been meeting to address these issues. Some of the proposals involve restructuring our MOU that would reflect more specific characteristics that is centered for a "school with in a school model" instead of a "stand alone" (which is currently used). Promote our teachers seeking a masters to begin training and staff development in advanced placement preparing them for the rigor expected by our higher ed partner. Involving our IHE in the planning of our master schedule to promote awareness on the needs of our students.

Edinburg Collegiate Prep uses Access Data for recruitment by requesting PEIMS information to identify economically disadvantage, At-risk, Special-Ed helping us to meet the Outcome Based Measure requirements In Achievement, TSI data is utilized to support, organize TSI interventions and schedule eligible college

courses. TSI data gives our teachers insight to the requirements students need to be TSI ready. For students having difficulty meeting TSI readiness standards, they will be provided with additional tutoring based on their diagnostics report with a minimum of four hours of tutoring before rescheduled exam.
