Describe how the IHE articulation agreement addresses the following IHE Blueprint Requirement: Curriculum alignment and courses of study, which enables a student to combine high school courses and college-level courses to earn either an associate degree, postsecondary certificate provided by an IHE, or industry certification.

PSJA Early College High School and South Texas College provides a rigorous course of study that enables participating students to receive a high school diploma and complete the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board's (THECB) core curriculum as defined by the Texas Administrative Code (TAC 4.28) or an associate's degree or at least 60 credit hours towards a baccalaureate degree during grades 9-12. The college gives credit for courses taken for dual credit for which Dual Credit Course Agreements have been approved with primary emphasis on the Core Curriculum requirements for all Associate of Arts and Associate of Science degrees. PSJA ECHS provides students with academic, social, and emotional support in their course of study. STC regularly updates the high school campus counselor and principal regarding curricular changes. PSJA ECHS is responsible for ensuring that state course requirements for high school graduation are fulfilled.

South Texas College provides advising opportunities to PSJA ECHS students as to the transferability and applicability to baccalaureate degree plans of all college credit offered and earned. All grade

reports for all students are produced and disseminated no later than 72 hours (3 business days) following the end of the academic term according to the published schedule. Grades are due in the Office of Admissions by the published date and time. Term and cumulative GPA's are reflected on grade reports. All transcript corrections due to major change or repeated course are updated prior to the next grade reporting period. The College's Registrar provides appropriate security and confidentiality measures for the reporting and posting of grade and the maintenance of transcripts. Courses are conducted at the facility provided by the school district and/or one of the college's campus within the college's service district upon agreement. Access to the college is made available following the College's Academic Calendar, including the summer. High school students, instructors, and appropriate staff receive a college campus identification card and have access to instructional and certain agreed upon non-instructional resources and services available on the campus of the college. PSJA ECHS students are college students. Therefore, the college's resources and services are available to support academic success. The district and college evaluate the facilities on an on-going basis and determine the necessity of adjusting facility available in future semesters and years.

PSJA ISD provides transportation (school bus) to students enrolled at PSJA ECHS as required, deemed necessary, and appropriate under State law and School District rules and procedures. The school district also provides transportation for all PSJA ECHS field trips and project-based learning activities focused on college and career. In addition, ECHS students enrolled in dual enrollment classes at the college will be transported at no cost or fees to the student.

FERPA allows protected student data to be exchanged between the college and school district for students that are dually enrolled without the consent of either the parents or the student under § 99.34. If the student is under 18, the parents still retain the right under FERPA to inspect and review any education records maintained by the school district, including records that the college disclosed. The college and the school district are expected to meet FERPA requirements to maintain the privacy of student data. The college provides data reports to the school district via standard reports as per identified timelines. These reports have been developed in an effort to provide required data in a timely manner to partners with a signed MOU.

Due to growing numbers with our partnering IHE there is a high demand for additional faculty. As a result, having enough educators with qualifications to teach dual credit is a challenge. In order to meet the needs of our dual credit student population, PSJA ISD is committed to offering master's degree level pathways. Teachers have opportunities to earn the appropriate educational and professional credentials to teach in their field or discipline as set forth by the IHEs accrediting agency. In addition, teachers who teach a dual credit course receive a stipend from the district to encourage the furthering of their education, thus positively impacting instruction in their classroom.

How does your academy use the access, achievement, and attainment data for program improvement?

Through a strong partnership PSJA ISD and South Texas College collaboratively created a data sharing agreement that allows both institutions to closely monitor student academic, social and emotional progress that ensures student success. PSJA ECHS utilizes combined data such as: assessment reports, sub-group performance, attendance, college entrance/admission data, and course outcomes to track student progress. PSJA ECHS uses this relevant information in designing students' Personal Graduation Plans ensuring that students are college and career ready. Early college students are guided in selecting a field of study in their area of interest. Using individual student data, degree plan guidance is provided regularly. In addition students can use Degree Works, an IHE self-advising tool. This software provides real-time advice, current progress towards the degree, stream lines the graduation process, and allows direct access to multiple related services and counsel. Based on data outcomes students are provided a variety of academic and social interventions to reinforce positive learning skills. Together with our IHE partner, we continuously monitor student progress to ensure all requirements are being met for both high school and college graduation.
