HSAPF's IHE partner is Austin Community College. The MOU lays out how Harmony and ACC will align high school graduation requirements and the Associate's of Arts Degree requirements. ACC will be responsible for all ECHS dual-credit and concurrent enrollment courses working in conjunction with Harmony ECHS designee and ACC staff as necessary to deliver the agreed-upon ECHS program. Regular meetings with ACC staff and district/campus staff will be held to ensure successful program implementation. Coordinate with Harmony to share information and coordinate policies regarding grading periods, courses of study, curriculum alignment, instructional calendar, student enrollment and attendance. Ensure the vertical alignment of college readiness skills and a college going culture for students feeding into ECHS and students currently enrolled in the ECHS. ACC will participate in planning to ensure that the necessary dual credit classes are scheduled in a timely manner to facilitate the goals of the ECHS.

Act as a resource for Harmony's Counseling Department to facilitate the college enrollment process for ECHS students. Facilitate the provision of student support services, including electronic resources for students enrolled in college courses. Coordinate with Harmony staff to accommodate students with disabilities enrolled in college courses, in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act. Assist in providing Harmony counselors with ECHS information for parents and students materials. Collaborate with ACC Departments to provide promotional and informational materials about ACC to Harmony counseling staff. Assist with the coordination for the provision of textbooks. Collaborate with campus staff and provide support for TSI testing as agreed upon for ECHS students, ACC will provide a designated advisor that meets monthly with ECHS staff and students. ACC designated staff screen all courses students take to ensure they are taking the designated courses. Be responsible for delivery of college services and will provide support and assistance to the Harmony Early College High School program, including reporting information designed to improve student retention and completion rates. Be responsible for all ECHS dual-credit and concurrent enrollment courses working with the ECHS designee and ACC staff as necessary to deliver the agreed-upon ECHS program, Provide support to ACC faculty, a, to assist them with successful program implementation. Regular meetings with ACC staff and district/campus staff will be held to ensure successful program implementation. Coordinate with Harmony to share information and coordinate policies regarding grading periods, courses of study, curriculum alignment, instructional calendar, student enrollment and attendance.

Describe how the IHE articulation agreement addresses the following IHE Blueprint Requirements: Transportation costs and fees including provisions for discontinuing operation while ensuring students previously enrolled will have opportunity to complete their course of study.

Harmony will arrange and pay for the cost of all buses transporting ECHS students to the ACC Northridge campus. Freshman and sophomore students in Harmony Early College will participate in dual credit courses on the Harmony campus. Beginning junior year, Harmony Early College students will be transported to ACC Northridge campus to take dual credit courses. Students are required to utilize the Harmony transportation services to and from Austin Community College. If a parent needs to bring the student to or pick up his/her student from Austin Community College, a transportation release form must be signed and filed in advance. Parents must sign their student in or out at the Harmony campus.

ACC complies with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), and that provides for the sharing of all allowable student level information with Harmony, including number of credit hours taken and earned, GPAs, state assessment results, SAT/ACT, PSAT scores, and TSI readiness by grade level. ACC will ensure that dual credit courses are delivered as necessary to meet the goals of the ECHS.

Where necessary and agreed upon, ACC staff will create additional ACC class sessions to facilitate the goals of the ECHS. Provide campus orientation and information to ACC faculty who are not part of the high school faculty, and will provide information about the standards of conduct for school district faculty and any rules and regulations unique to the high school environment. The ACC staff will assist high school campus staff and ACC faculty with communication and problem solving. Facilitate SQHSCF participation as appropriate in ACC orientation activities, ACC professional development and required evaluation activities, and college and student success initiatives. Ensure that the ACC course load of SQHSCF or other faculty are adjusted as needed to deliver instruction necessary to accomplish the goals of the ECHS. Work with academic departments and ACC faculty to encourage reuse of required textbooks and other materials purchased for ECHS by Harmony.

HSAPf has been fortunate to have on staff several faculty members that have the credentials to teach dual credit courses. We currently offer dual credit courses taught by current HSAPf teachers. Additionally, HPS is committed to providing the opportunity for teachers to earn additional credentials by offering the Harmony Employee Education Program (HEEP). HEEP provides financial support to eligible HPS employees through tuition assistance and assistance with tuition related expenses incurred by employees striving to attain certification or graduate degree.

How does your academy use the access, achievement, and attainment data for program improvement?

Data driven decision-making allows us to understand whether our campus is meeting our mission and vision. HSAPf is committed to using data to make smarter decisions to get results. -Using College Readiness data, we are able to see where we need to put more resources whether financial or personnel. Based on last years results, we determined that we needed to implement a TSI assessment calendar. This will allow us to capture our students early and identify which students need additional support. We also now offer a College and Career Readiness course for our students in grades 8-12. -We utilize the PSAT scores to determine additional English and Math lab support. -Using district assessment data, we establish our intervention and tutorial protocols. This allows us to provide additional support for the STAAR and EOC exams. -Using STAAR and EOC results, we offer summer

bridge programs to help produce gains. -We utilize student and parent attendance to activities and events to gauge campus climate and engagement. To ensure all parents have opportunities to engage with teachers and administration, our campus utilizes home visits.
