The goal of Irving ISD is to provide high quality educational opportunities designed to close the gaps for underrepresented students and ensure their attainment of postsecondary credentials needed to meet labor market demands and achieve high wage career opportunities. For the past year, our Chief of School Leadership, Assistant Chief of High Schools, Director of Guidance, Counseling and College Readiness, and Director of Career and Technical Education have been in frequent discussions with personnel at Dallas College about expanding opportunities for students to earn an Associate's degree while also completing high school. With the support of our school board, Superintendent of Schools, and community stakeholders, we have decided to pursue a designation for South Irving Collegiate Academy @ Dallas College.

Student support will be essential to the secondary and postsecondary success of students. The school counselor will be an advocate for students to educate, guide, advise, and counsel students as they matriculate from one grade level to the next. Students will receive academic support and advisement related to high school and college courses, pathways of study, and TSIA/SAT/ACT registration. Students will receive personalized, one-on-one advisement sessions designed to help them understand both high school and college curriculum requirements. Students will also receive individualized support to ensure college access related to college admission, financial aid, and scholarships. Counselors will work with teachers, administrators, staff members to address concerns that may put students at-risk for dropout. School counselors will also work to ensure students know how to access student support services available through Dallas College.
