The Early College High School shall have a current, signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for each school year that defines the partnership between the school district(s) and the institution(s) of higher education (IHE).

Describe how the IHE articulation agreement addresses the following IHE Blueprint Requirement: Curriculum alignment and courses of study, which enables a student to combine high school courses and college-level courses to earn either an associate degree, postsecondary certificate provided by an IHE, or industry certification.

The most important aspect of the agreement is creating an on-campus college culture for the ECHS students who will be on campus full-time. Courses of study were carefully examined and chosen specifically for students within the target population. Designed within the articulation agreement is a 4-year course of study plan that will allow students to begin taking entry level college courses as early as 9th grade, and in the long term, allow students in 11th and 12th grade to enter more college level courses as they progress through their degree plans and satisfy high school graduation requirements. Deep levels of rigor and relevance will be embedded in all coursework within the course of study, with students having first-level access to remediation, if needed. All ECHS students will be required to meet course prerequisites in order to advance. Dual credit students enrolled at ECHS will have the opportunity to achieve an Associate Degree in Applied Science, as well as Level I and Level II post-secondary certificates, and up to 60 hours of college credit as agreed upon by both entities.

Galena Park CTE ECHS is located on a college campus where students have full access to a variety of programs and opportunities. ECHS administrators work closely with the dual-credit liaison from the IHE partner to ensure timely advising and scheduling for students of all grade levels. When applicable, students receive counseling on common advising questions such as transcript authenticity, transferability of credits to a 4-year institution, and any articulation agreements with colleges that may benefit the students. The ECHS also employs two full time counselors, who regularly collaborate with the IHE to ensure student success. Beginning in 9th grade, students enrolled at ECHS have regular access to the IHE dual credit office where they may ask questions about upcoming coursework in their degree plan as well as seek guidance as to their next steps in either a 4- year institution or in a job search. ECHS students have access to all IHE facilities under the supervision of the ECHS staff and administration. The IHE partner also hosts a variety of activities that are of interest to young individuals, as well as regularly scheduled college and job fairs. ECHS students also have full access to any SEL programs or activities that the IHE partner deems appropriate for students under the age of 18. During the restrictions and closures due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the students of ECHS had full access to members of the IHE community via electronic communication methods.

Describe how the IHE articulation agreement addresses the following IHE Blueprint Requirements: Transportation costs and fees including provisions for discontinuing operation while ensuring students previously enrolled will have opportunity to complete their course of study.

Within the articulation agreement, Galena Park ISD and ECHS assume all transportation costs for student travel, which includes full services to and from campus, field trips, testing centers (when necessary), and internship/externship sites. If a student chooses to suspend their coursework for a period of time, they will have an opportunity to continue as long as the chosen program still offers specific degree or certificate within the time frame preceding graduation.

ECHS administrators and counselors, along with IHE dual credit office continuously share important data as it pertains to student progress. Both entities will create working/living documents, with FERPA protections, to share and enter data as needed. This includes programs of study and the requirements for completion, TSI score sharing, total credit hours, overall GPA, which can affect enrollment, and any other pertinent information.

How does your academy use the access, achievement, and attainment data for program improvement?

Specific to the area of access, ECHS focuses on two areas of improvement, African American students, and at-risk students. In order to offer programs to a wide variety of students, this data is helpful to the academy to ensure that students who do not traditionally attend ECHS campuses are given extra recruitment opportunities. These two demographics are very important to overall program growth but can be difficult to recruit because of activities that are only offered on a more traditional campus. Specific to achievement OBMs, the academy utilizes TSI requirements and sets the bar at the Distinguished level even though the academy is not currently recognized in that category. The academy updates the percentages each month and uses the data as a guide for which areas and grade levels need remediation and further opportunities to take the exams. The academy works closely with the IHE partner to ensure that all students are enrolled in comprehensive and coherent sequence of college level courses that will satisfy TEA CCMR requirements as well as programs of study. Because of the unique coursework required by some of the programs offered, this outcome-based measure is the most important data piece used by academy.
