Recruitment and Enrollment

Describe any changes in established plans for recruitment and enrollment process that meet open enrollment requirements.

The recruitment and enrollment process follows the established elements in Benchmark 1 of the Early College Hig School Blueprint. The recruitment process is in December, as our community is invited to Advanced Academics Night. Though the Lufkin ECHS is open for all incoming 9th Grade students to apply, intentional promotion is given to underrepresented subpopulations. Informational sessions are provided at community events within the Advancing African American Success night and the Evento en Espanol Celebrado y Educado. The student selection is completed by a weighted lottery favoring students who are At-Risk and Economically Disadvantaged. We will continue to recruit and track data for all underrepresented students even though the current ECHS Blueprint does not require a proportional number of male African American and Hispanic students. The intent is for the Lufkin ECHS to reflect the enrollment of Lufkin ISD.. We will continue to utilize events such as Taste of LHS for middle school students to experience a day in the life of an ECHS student. We are incorporating Student Ambassadors through the month of January to help with small group student presentations with 8th-grade students to promote and answer questions while applications are open.

The Early College High School shall have a current, signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for each school year that defines the partnership between the school district(s) and the institution(s) of higher education (IHE).

Describe how the IHE articulation agreement addresses the following IHE Blueprint Requirement: Curriculum alignment and courses of study, which enables a student to combine high school courses and college-level courses to earn either an associate degree, postsecondary certificate provided by an IHE, or industry certification.

The Lufkin Early College High School Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Angelina College consists of several documents: the actual MOU, a data-sharing agreement, a dual credit articulation agreement, and a student safety agreement. Section C of the MOU addresses the course of study whereby students in the Lufkin ECHS have the opportunity to receive a high school diploma and the opportunity to gain up to 60 semester hours towards an Associate of Art in General Studies. A four-year crosswalk is in place detailing how students will progress toward this goal, including alignment of high school and college-level courses. This crosswalk provides pathways to various postsecondary

credentials, including coursework toward a Level 1 Certificate, completion of the Texas Core Curriculum, and an Associate of Arts in General Studies. The updated MOU specifies the Core 42 as an option as measured in the Attainment OBM.

Describe how the IHE articulation agreement addresses the following IHE Blueprint Requirements: Policies for: 1) advising students on the transferability of all college credit offered and earned, 2) ensuring the IHE transcripts college credit earned through dual credit in the same semester that credit is earned, 3) advising students as to the transferability and applicability to baccalaureate degree plans for all college credit offered and earned (college credits earned during high school should allow students to progress from an associate degree to a bachelor's degree and beyond in their chosen field), 4) students accessing the IHE facilities, services and resources

Continual conversations between the ECHS and IHE ensure that we are aligned with the MOU; these meetings may be in person or virtual as needed. The awarding of credit for courses is addressed in Section B of the current MOU whereby the dual credit courses 'shall have been evaluated and approved through the official College curriculum approval process in accordance with the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board requirements and transcripted through the Angelina College Student Portal as designated in Section 8 of the Dual Credit Articulation agreement as well as the Data Sharing Agreement. Required postsecondary advising by Angelina College personnel as part of Senate Bill 25 to develop a viable degree plan completed, which aids in the conversations about transferability and applicability to a four-year university or entrance into the workforce. This advising includes discussing the appropriateness of an Associate's Degree vs. Core Curriculum attainment. In this conversation, the Blueprint changes and data collection to measure the completion of the 'Texas Core Curriculum (Core 42) by graduation' are discussed. All ECHS students have access to the IHE facilities, services, and resources. Students access online resources through the Blackboard and/or Angelina College website. This has been vital during COVID as students access additional resources and tutorial opportunities in a virtual experience. ECHS students are granted an Angelina College ID, which grants entrance to any sporting and/or fine arts event and Angelina College resources.

Describe how the IHE articulation agreement addresses the following IHE Blueprint Requirements: Transportation costs and fees including provisions for discontinuing operation while ensuring students previously enrolled will have opportunity to complete their course of study.

In Section 1 of the current MOU, it is explicitly stated that the ISD will incur any transportation costs and fees included in any future transportation of students to and from the IHE Campus. Currently, all dual credit coursework is completed on the ISD campus by vetted adjunct instructors who are employed by the ISD. At the present time, there are no plans to transport students to the IHE campus for coursework. Dual credit courses will be offered in Summer 2023 at the ISD. Concerning the discontinuation of operation, this is covered in Section 7 of the current MOU. According to the MOU, 'the institution teaches out currently enrolled students; no longer admits students to programs; and terminates the program 'in the event of a decision such as this. Since we are already beginning the recruitment procedures for the Lufkin ECHS Class of 2027 and are now a demonstration site, discontinuation of operation is not in our foreseeable future.

As mentioned, we have a separate Data Privacy and Confidentiality Agreement with the IHE, which addresses complete data sharing. According to Section 3.1, Access to College Information Resources, we are granted access to the Angelina College Portal, which allows us to view real-time student data. In addition, the Director and Success Coach have been added as 'view only' instructors to all dual credit course Blackboards to facilitate this process further. This agreement specifies that the 'District's ECHS Director, College Readiness Facilitator (Success Coach) and Director of Counseling will be provided network access' which allows us to track students' course work to timely advise and counsel students concerning the transition to college, degree plans, attendance, and other matters relating to the students' dual enrollment. Individual student data is used to generate reports and analyze program effectiveness. The Data Sharing Agreement specifies that future longitudinal data includes college hour accumulation, aggregate GPA, certificate and degree attainment, core complete status, and analysis of courses needed by students for various purposes, including planning and scheduling. The MOU has further explanation to include the newly hired Dual Credit Facilitator for non-Early College High School students who are enrolled in dual credit coursework.

Since we continue to offer all dual credit courses on the IHE campus as well as securing our own vetted dual credit instructors, finding qualified educators that meet the requirements as adjunct instructors by the IHE has proven challenging. The ISD continues to offer a "Grow Your Own" Dual Credit Instructor program which started in the Fall of 2018. This program was created to encourage existing ISD staff members who already have a master's degree in another area to gain the additional 18 hours in the content area needed for the dual credit course. We have had five individuals complete the program and are now employed as dual credit instructors. We have two individuals who will complete the required hours this summer to be fully vetted by the 2023-2024 school year. We are already in the 2023-2024 personnel planning process, as we will need to secure dual credit instructors for Chemistry, and Math.

With the recommendations and assistance of our TEA Technical Assistant, as well as leadership and stakeholder communications, we use student data to project OBM attainment and identify areas of needed improvement. A relevant example of this is the data tracking of TSI attainment. As the coordinating board approves and sets exemptions and standards for dual credit enrollment, multiple students in the senior class could not enroll in their Dual Credit Math courses due to not having an Alg I score. They didn't have a score due to the Pandemic shutdown. This has pushed all students to complete the TSIA. 2 Math section. Tracking these students' progress truly helps adjust their courses and placement.
