The parties (Houston Community College and Alief Early College High School) partner to provide the following courses and programs: Dual Credit Courses, College Prep Math and English Courses, Data Sharing, Alief Early College High School and CTE Early College High School Programs. Students enroll in dual credit courses that are "crosswalked" with high school courses for both high school and college credit. Students who complete the mandatory required coursework graduate with both their high school diploma and Associate's Degree.

Alief Early College High School has a part time IHE advisor that assists in planning and following the degree plan for earning an Associates Degree in either Arts, Science, or Engineering Science. Additionally, students who continue their education at a four year university or other post-secondary option are advised of the transferability of their credits. The IHE transcripts and high school transcripts are audited for accuracy by campus counselors, content coordinators, the graduation center adviser and the campus registrar each semester. Students have complete access to all IHE facilities and resources.

Transportation is provided by Alief ISD for Aleif Early College High School students.. The IHE has no dealings with the transportation of Alief Early College High School students at any time.

At Alief Early College High School, students begin TSI testing and interventions in Summer Bridge prior to their 9th grade year.. Student data is tracked by the counselors and content specialist to ensure that students are on track for college readiness. Teachers use formative data and meet as teams to track and advise students. The IHE provides a part-time adviser that works directly with Alief Early College High School and has access to teacher and student data. The adviser reviews and shares information such as college credits attempted and completed, GPA, and TSI results to assess if students are on track for their Associate's Degree.
