Director, Dual Credit Programs

The Early College High School shall have a current, signed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for each school year that defines the partnership between the school district(s) and the institution(s) of higher education (IHE).

Describe how the IHE articulation agreement addresses the following IHE Blueprint Requirement: Curriculum alignment and courses of study, which enables a student to combine high school courses and college-level courses to earn either an associate degree,

Blinn College will provide access to courses that are included in the College's approved THECB core curriculum, as well as other course options that are major specific, or could serve as electives to all qualified RECHS students. RISD will be responsible for ensuring alignment between Texas Education Knowledge and Skills and college course objectives in order to grant dual credit. RECHS will work with Blinn to ensure the quality and instructional rigor of the dual credit program. RECHS will work with Blinn to vertically align RECHS high school courses with dual credit courses. RISD will allow RECHS to alter the scope and sequence of high school courses as needed to meet the goals of vertical alignment to dual credit courses.

Blinn college will provide adequate instructional support services, including advising and counseling to meet the needs of RECHS students. Appendix C of the Blinn College and Royal ECHS MOU establishes common advising strategies and terminology related to dual credit and college readiness. All dual credit students will receive academic and college readiness advising with access to bridge them successfully into college course completion. Advising and career counseling are offered to all dual credit students. Dual credit programs will assist high school students in the successful transition to and acceleration through postsecondary education. Blinn College will allow RECHS students the same access to the Learning Center, the Writing Center, Disability Services, Counseling, the Testing Center, Libraries, and Open Computer Labs. Blinn College will transcript/award college credit earned through dual credit during the same semester that credit is earned.

Describe how the IHE articulation agreement addresses the following IHE Blueprint Requirements: Transportation costs and fees including provisions for discontinuing operation while ensuring students previously enrolled will have opportunity to complete their course of study.

The ECHS will operate on RISD property. RECHS will provide classroom space and the necessary equipment for all Blinn courses taught on the RECHS campus. Dual credit courses are taught by either certified and vetted Royal ISD instructors or vetted Blinn College adjunct faculty. Blinn College courses taught by Blinn College instructors vary from face-to-face, hybrid, and online models. Transportation costs of students to Blinn College for Summer Bridge, field-trips, or any other necessary trip is covered by RISD. If the partners decide to discontinue operating RECHS, they must meet the provisions listed below: --An eleventh grade cohort, at RECHS, will continue operation through that cohort's scheduled graduation from RECHS. --Services to enrolled ninth and tenth grade students will be continued through graduation for those cohorts. --While in the process of discontinuing operation, RECHS may not enroll any additional students in grades that have been phased out. --While RECHS is in the process of discontinuing operation, it must continue to meet all of the required design elements and provide full support for all students enrolled in RECHS>

While considering the dissemination of student data, all FERPA guidelines will be followed by RECHS and Blinn. Blinn College faculty and staff will not speak to RECHS parents without a FERPA release form on file. An RECHS designee will be granted view only access to review RECHS student grades. All teachers hired by RISD to teach at RECHS must meet Texas state certification requirements in their subject areas and must be licensed by the State of Texas. RISD faculty will only teach dual credit courses if they meet faculty credentialing guidelines recommended by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges' Comprehensive Standard 6.2a. Any instructor teaching IHE classes, for dual credit, must be evaluated in accordance with the THECB and SACSCOC standards by the IHE staff. Faculty from the IHE who teach college courses on the RECHS campus will be considered faculty of the employed IHE. All Dual credit course teachers must meet the faculty credentialing guidelines recommended by the SACSCOC. All Blinn College employees teaching courses on the RECHS campus will be required to undergo a criminal history background check with RISD, as required by RISD policy and applicable law. RISD will appoint an RECHS administration whole only responsibility is administration of RECHS. The RECHS on-site administrator will have decisionmaking authority in ISD matters of budgeting, staffing, scheduling, student assessment, curriculum, and professional development in congruence with RISD, RECHS, and TEA policy.

RECHS is currently outfitted with embedded dual credit instructors, vetted by SBEC as well as Blinn College. With the current teacher shortage and due to limited availability of instructors qualified to teach specific courses only offered at certain points in the students' dual-credit program, RECHS also utilizes IHE faculty members to teach "singleton" courses such as dual-credit music, speech, etc. The courses are offered face-to-face whenever possible, with the IHE faculty member teaching on the RECHS campus. If face-to-face instruction is not possible, the IHE provides online courses to RECHS students, with RECHS faculty members serving as "monitor teachers" who are present for any and all instruction given by the IHE faculty members. In turn, these RECHS faculty members are able to assist students with any struggles that might arise from not having an in-person instructor. Services such as tutoring and time-management assistance are then provided to the students by these RECHS monitor teachers in compliance with FERPA and Blinn College policies.

The Director of Advanced Academics meets biweekly with the campus administrator to target areas of program improvement and provide data-based recommendations for program implementation. In addition, the Director of Advanced Academics serves as the RECHS program administrator and meets with RECHS teachers weekly to discuss areas of program and student struggles and plan for necessary support. All RECHS access, achievement, and attainment program data is used in planning for each school year--particularly in the areas of recruitment/enrollment, TSIA2 success, and student success in dual credit courses. Areas for growth are identified annually with the assistance of the CCRSM Leadership Coach and specific goals are created to address those areas.
