Recruitment and Enrollment

Describe any changes in established plans for recruitment and enrollment process that meet open enrollment requirements.

The Career Center at Riverside High School serves as a hub for students from throughout our district and region. Students are recruited in both 8th and 10th grade from all district middle and high schools.

Due to COVID-19, presentations are being held virtually for the 2020-2021 school year on December 8, 2020 and January 12, 2020. Program recruitment and enrollment have been open to all interested students since the P-TECH Academy was established. Program participation is introduced as either four- or two-year options. The students complete an interest form and are notified of acceptance based on program availability. Counseling staff verifies progress of graduation requirements to ensure that all are met prior to enrollment.

Describe how the Business/Industry articulation agreement addresses the following Business/Industry Blueprint Requirements: Clear roles and responsibilities for work site supervisors, mentors, teachers, support personnel, and other partners.

Each participating business is provided with a Memorandum of Understanding with a list of activities in which they can participate. Once an employer is ready to provide a paid or unpaid internships, the

instructor meets with the employer to outline the program requirements and helps to define the roles and responsibilities for each individual involved. A training plan is signed by the student, parent/guardian, instructor and employer. An evaluation is completed by the employer every nine weeks and reviewed with the instructor and student. Instructors are required to meet with the employer a minimum of six times per school year. Additional meetings can be scheduled if specific issues need to be addressed. Our skilled trades instructors have extensive experience in industry and provide relevant coursework based on those experiences and history, and continue to work with industry contacts, as well. The CTE Workplace Learning Coordinator works with students, instructors and employers to provide additional opportunities, to help ensure that students are aligned with related industry business partners, and are engaged in contextual and work-based learning as they make connections between prior knowledge and skills gained through the coherent sequence of courses.

Describe how the Business/Industry articulation agreement addresses the following Business/Industry Blueprint Requirements: Support for students' activities, such a clubs, Career and Technical Student Organizations, competitions, and special invitations.

As previously mentioned, each participating business is provided with a Memorandum of Understanding with a list of activities in which they can participate. Once a business is ready to partner with the campus or instructor, they meet to outline participation and specific program or event requirements. Our business partners serve our campus, students and instructors in various capacities, including volunteering as classroom presenters, mentors at Career Center Summer Leadership camps, by providing program funding, serving as members of Program Advisory Boards, serving as project mentors, assisting instructors with curriculum development, and serving as judges for student competitive events.

Describe how the Business/Industry articulation agreement addresses the following Business/Industry Blueprint Requirements: Student access to business and industry partners and work-based learning facilities, services, and resources.

Students have access to business and industry partners, their facilities and resources through various activities throughout the school year. The P-TECH Academy students participate in Manufacturing Day, which is held in October each year and allows businesses to partner with the campus for facility tours. Some of our partners allow site visits throughout the year; others invite us to their facilities to attend or assist with specific company events. In addition, students in internships and part-time employment have specific access to facilities and resources based on their position and department to which they are assigned.

YISD provides transportation to and from events (Manufacturing Days, off-campus Career Days, etc.). However, students are required to provide their own transportation to and from internships. Public transportation information is provided to students as needed.

A P-TECH committee comprised of campus, district and IHE stakeholders was established and met monthly to develop the curriculum alignment and course of study to enable students to take the high school and college-level courses required for their pathway. A crosswalk which lists the courses, industry certification, IHE degree and/or post-secondary certificate was developed and is shared with the P-TECH students.

The P-TECH Academy has a designated counselor that advises students on the items listed above. In addition, a summer bridge camp will be offered in summer 2021 for current 10th grade students to introduce them to IHE counseling staff, services and resources. Credentialed IHE instructors reviews course and degree or certificate requirements and resources with students. All students enrolled in dual credit courses at El Paso Community College (EPCC) have access to facilities, resources and services at the IHE, including tutoring, academic, and support services. Professional development is provided to all instructors through EPCC.

Most Dual Credit courses offered at the Career Center are provided by credentialed instructors on campus. Should students need to take a course in person at EPCC, Ysleta ISD will provide transportation.

The district has a designated CTE Coordinator that works directly with the P-TECH Academy and IHE counselors and staff for the development of crosswalks, teacher credentialing and course requirements, as well as, scheduling. IHE will be giving access to the P-TECH Counselor to student records to keep track of credit hours taken and earned and GPA's so that he can advise students. Instructors have access to student records and also work directly with students enrolled in their courses. Academy administration, counselor and instructors regularly review and track student progress and college readiness.

The P-TECH Academy uses a variety of methods to ensure program success, such as, the number of students enrolled in each of the programs, their academic progress within their course of study, the number of certifications attained by students, the number of dual credit college hours earned and the number of hours each student completes through paid and unpaid internships. Classroom instructors track individual student achievement. The P-TECH Academy administrator and counselor review individual EOC, TSI and academic course scores to provide individual assistance for students in areas of need and overall program improvement. Students are prepared through rigorous academic courses, TSI tutorial programs, and remediation camps and HB5 classes as needed by students. The Advisory Board reviews program success, assists with program curriculum development and updates.
