By partnering with Rotan ISD in this program, WTC will be able to provide students who are historically underrepresented or might not be able to attend college with the opportunity to obtain an associate degree while still in high school. WTC agrees to partner with Rotan ISD to help develop a crosswalk and plans that include: Curriculum Alignment; Instructional Materials; Instructional Calendar; Program/Course of Study; Student Enrollment and Attendance; Grading Periods and Policies; and Administration of Statewide Assessments.
