The Memorandum of Understanding states that Clarendon College will ensure that a dual credit course and the corresponding course offered at Clarendon College are equivalent with respect to the curriculum, materials, instructions, and method/rigor of student evaluation. Clarendon College will provide curriculum, common assessments, and identify textbooks. Classes will be offered on the high school campus through embedded instructors or traveling adjuncts, at the local Clarendon College campus, and online. Clarendon College will offer tutoring services and locations for students. Houston Community College will provide Texas Success Initiative Assessment tutoring materials and programs. promote student success through participation in college visits and in academic and admission procedures, including advisement, registration procedures, assessment and placement procedures, at CC. In addition, weekend, Saturday, or summer programs and activities, and extracurricular activities may be offered by the WDISD, CC, or both. Students will gain access to the CC facilities by way of their CC student ID cards.

1. Clarendon College has counselors on campus to meet with students to discuss their degree plans and how it can be transferred to baccalaureate programs. 2. After the end of the Clarendon College semester grades and credits earned are sent to campus principal, counselor, and the P-TECH grant manager. 3. Students will meet continually with their Clarendon College counselor, campus counselor and P-TECH grant manager to ensure the student is aware and utilizing the knowledge of the transferability and applicability to baccalaureate degree plans of their high school dual credit courses. The counselor and P-TECH grant manager. will also establish college visits to local universities for students to be able to speak directly to college advisers. 4. Students are given a tour of Clarendon College campus, receive a library tour, are able to access the Clarendon College website to utilize the resources, and possibly attend classes on the Clarendon College campus.

Transportation costs and fees are handled by White Deer Independent School District. The cost of all fees are waved for the students involve in the Pathways in Technology Early College High School program. If there is a discontinuation of operations, any student currently in the program will be able to finish the program and complete all dual credit classes and certifications.

Dual Credit Course(s) Enrollment/Completion Information: Course name, Course ID, Instructional Mode, Semester Grade, Semester & Cumulative GPA, Clarendon College Program and Plan, Associate Degree Earned, and License Awarded, Certification Awarded. Indicators of Student Academic Standing: Early Alert, Academic Probation/Suspension, Dean's List and Eligibility for Academic Honors. The P-TECH campus at White Deer High School will provide: Enrollment information for all students: first name, last name, middle initial, Texas Student Data Systems (TSDS) number or other student record identifier, date of birth (DOB), meningitis immunization record, high school attendance, including semester identifiers, date of high school graduation, endorsement areas of each student, and cumulative GPAs. Clarendon College will provide persistence data: student identifier, semester identifier, enrolled in credit course this semester , and available TSIA/diagnostic results of students tested from the P-TECH campus at White Deer High School, as available.
