Describe how and why your campus made the decision to apply for a Planning Year. Include the stakeholders that were involved in the decision process.

In the Socorro Independent School District (SISD), we want to ensure all students are afforded the opportunity to graduate from high school prepared for the college and career of their choice. Becoming a P-TECH will help in facilitating this process. Our school board, Associate Superintendent, Career and Technical Education Director, and district cabinet, along with campus leadership, took part in this decision-making process. The instructors are credentialed through our IHE partner, El Paso Community College (EPCC), and will be providing the coursework. Currently, in our region, we have a need for both educators and those working in the medical field. Just in our district alone, we have ninety vacancies for educators and 3 vacancies for school nurses. The decision to proceed with the P-TECH academy was made with these vacancies, and those that are forthcoming, in mind. These occupations are also listed in Workforce Solutions Borderplex as occupations in great need. Another program that has been put in place by TEA is the Grow Your Own program, part of the TEA Strategic Plan for 2017-2021 set forth by Commissioner Mike Morath. The program will focus on developing students at the high school level to enroll in the Education and Training pathway in order to begin creating our own pipeline into the teaching profession. Through the P-TECH program, we will be able to provide opportunities within our school district for students to get a head start and to focus on careers in education and the medical field.

Curriculum and Support

The P-TECH academy will provide wrap-around strategies and services involving multiple stakeholders (parents, teachers, counselors, community members, etc.) to strengthen both the academic, technical, and individual support for students for students to be successful in rigorous academic and work-based learning experiences. Describe how the campus plans to provide students with layered academic support by personalizing their learning environment. Examples include developing individualized student plans, academic support for intervention/remediation/acceleration, tutoring for identified students in need, application/financial aid/college/career counseling, advisory and/or college readiness support time built into program of study, providing bridge programs, and establishing an industry mentorship program.

Bulldog P-TECH will provide college readiness opportunities during fall, spring, and summer intersessions to offer students the remediation and enrichment necessary to prepare for the TSIA2. In addition, individual academic conferences with students to review progress and address areas of concern will take place every 3, 6, and 9 weeks. Our counseling staff will meet with the students on their Texas Achievement Plan and Audit Card. We will also have our district Early College Advisors review the students' course plan with them each year. The summer Bridge Camp will provide an introduction into the high school program and the program expectations. Additionally, SISD will provide job shadowing opportunities during every intersession in collaboration with industry partners. Finally, Bulldog P-TECH students will have access to the EPCC resources offered, including the college library, tutoring, writing center, and counseling services.

Year-at-a-Glance planners will be designed each year to evaluate and provide continuity in progress monitoring. In addition, social and emotional needs will be addressed through our Capturing Kids Hearts program, wherein we teach time management, stress-related coping strategies, employability, and study skills. Bulldog P-TECH students will have access to Community-in-Schools services, consisting of individual meetings with students to support any needs, along with parent presentations of various support organizations throughout the community. Bulldog P-TECH has an array of business partners in both education and the medical field. Our students in the Education and Training program will have opportunities for externships in our elementary and middle schools around our district to get their work-based learning experiences. Our medical route (HPA) students will have the opportunity to work with our nursing department throughout the year to provide job shadowing and community outreach experiences. Parent grade level nights will be scheduled to provide valuable information about student progress, financial literacy, FAFSA, etc. Twice a year, we will hold advisory meetings for outside entities to provide their feedback for potential growth or changes needed within our programs. Project Vida and our Military Liaisons will also provide support to our students in areas of need.

Bulldog P-TECH will provide opportunities for teacher training on TSIA2. Students also will have access to the self-paced software, Edgenuity, which can be accessed 24-7. Students will take required courses which will provide rigorous instruction to meet the high demand of the test. These classes will also have high yield research-based best practices to ensure the support systems are in place for student success. Students will be part of TSIA2 bridge camps, which will provide students with accelerated instruction and enrichment opportunities to be successful in their TSIA2. Students will also be provided multiple testing opportunities. College tutors will be available to the students to get one-to-one support. Finally, we will be working with our IHE partner, EPCC, to provide our students with resources such as Edgenuity.

SISD has a Dual Credit Scholarship Program designed to recruit teachers and pay for their continued education in the fields of study needed. In addition, the office of Advanced Academics provides support and training for teachers who teach Dual Credit. College coordinators at EPCC also provide support to teachers as they work to build and expand their programs. Teacher Externship programs are available for teachers to gather experience in their chosen field to ensure we maintain the level of relevance and integrity needed to build quality programs. There is a Dual Credit stipend offered for each course taught and professional development is provided to all instructors as needed.

Recruitment and Enrollment

The P-TECH academy shall be open enrollment for all students. Recruitment and enrollment processes shall identify, recruit, and enroll subpopulations of at-risk students (as defined by PEIMS), including, but not limited to, students who are of limited English proficiency, students with disabilities, or students who have failed a state administered assessment. In addition to those who are at risk as defined by PEIMS, the P-TECH shall identify, recruit and enroll subpopulations that are historically underrepresented in college courses. Enrollment decisions shall not be based on state assessment scores, discipline history, teacher recommendation, parent or student essays, minimum grade point average (GPA), or other criteria that create barriers for student enrollment.

SISD holds Advanced Academy nights every year to share information with students and parents about the programs available to them; Bulldog P-TECH will be one of the programs featured. Eighth grade students in their Entrepreneurship courses will have opportunity to make their program selections based on interest. Afterwards, students will be put in a lottery for a blind selection process. In addition, we offer House Bill 5 Tours/Nights to educate parents and expose students to various pathways and career choices at both the middle and high school level. Operation College Bound and Early College Advisory meetings are offered at the high school level for all students, while FAFSA nights and college readiness informational nights are offered for parents. Our campus website is, and will continue to be, updated frequently to ensure the community has consistent access to current information and updates.
