The MOU states that Parker will identify a dedicated staff person to manage the responsibilities and other appropriate staff to participate in our partnership. This dedicated staff person communicates weekly with our Counselor to support the relationship with the School. This staff person coordinates site visits to the Parker facilities, recruit and match mentors to students, identify appropriate internship opportunities, and support teachers and faculty in developing appropriate curricula and training to support students in becoming eligible for hire at Parker.

The Interlocal Agreement (ILA) states that Weatherford College (WC) agrees to provide core curriculum and AA/AS degree plans to help GPA students identify and request appropriate dual credit courses and track semester credit hour accumulation. WC also agrees to provide postsecondary certificate training programs at the new Workforce Training Facility as well as other college level training courses for industry certification.

Finding solutions to problems can be handled immediately due to our small size. The project director is the Superintendent, which means direct access to those involved in the grant implementation, including the business manager, principal, counselor, and teachers. The P-TECH leadership team will review continued implementation at their regular meetings, make program recommendations, review strategies, and make adjustments.
