The College will provide dual credit students with the same access to academic advising, counseling, computer services, and library services and resources that it provides to other college students. The students also will have access to library services at the high school. Students who anticipate a need for special accommodations must contact the Special Services Office on the Levelland campus. Adequate notice to make arrangements for necessary accommodations is required. The Texas Administrative Code, rule §9.145 requires that grading criteria should be devised to allow faculty to award high school only or both high school and college credit depending upon student performance. Pursuant to the is requirement, and in recognition of the High School's role in awarding high school credit, South Plains College agrees that the High School will determine whether to award high school credit in the event that college credit is not awarded. Appropriate credit will be transcripted immediately upon a student's successful completion of the course. High school students are considered college students if they are enrolled in a college course. College personnel only report mid-term and final grades and do not provide "fail" notices to districts for UIL purposes. Numeric grades will be furnished to the high school for those students that have signed a waiver of release of information.

All dual credit courses are completed on the High School campus and no transportation costs are incurred by the students.

Dual Credit classes will be proctored by a Shallwater TSTEM Academy employee. The final grade will be included in the students college GPA, but not in the High School GPA.



We review all the data and determine which, if any, demographics are being under served. The only demographic we fell short in this year was females. We created recruitment videos for all of our programs with a heavy emphasis on including females in all our programs. The special programs director meets one on one with students from any demographic that has the potential to be successful in STEM classes and activities to encourage them to choose those options.

Shallowater T-STEM students participate in FIRST Robotics, Intel Science and Engineering Fair, Rocketry Competitions, Science Bowl, Texas Alliance for Minorities in Engineering Contests, Early Dedication to Medical Education Internships, High School Aerospace Scholars programs, National Youth Leadership Forums in Medicine, as well as other leadership activities through Student Council, FFA, FCCLA, TAFE, and Skills USA competitions. Moreover, our students actively participate in summer internship work with multiple area veterinarians, the Texas Workforce Commission, John Hopkins Medical School and Texas Tech Health Science Center.
