You might have seen a few new faces floating around BCCC. Ryan Lawson joined the CC team in September as a full time field officer.



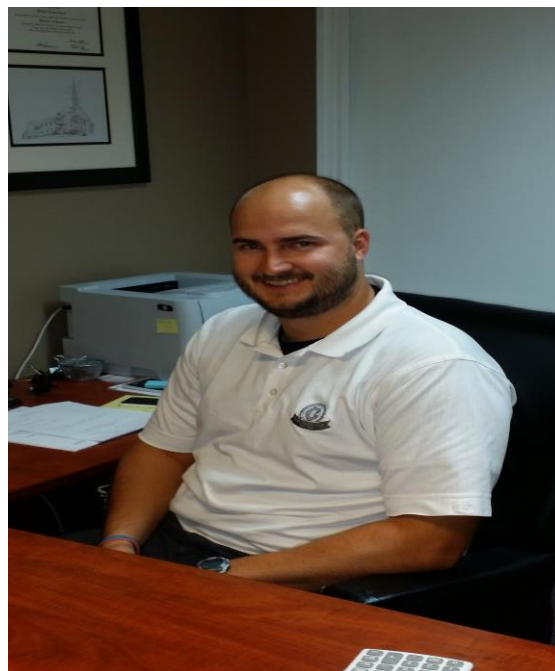
## COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS APPOINTS NEW EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

## COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS RECEIVES INCENTIVE MONEY FROM DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS

## RENOVATIONS

Juvenile Probation has a new location! A new juvenile probation department was created in the back of the existing probation and community corrections department. Juveniles will now enter and exit through a separate entrance via the stairwell located on the South side of the Key Bank building off the south entrance of the bank lobby. The new office is much friendlier and therapeutic for the juveniles. Yearly each officer sees around 250-300 juveniles. The remodel looks great! A big thank you to all of the staff that helped make this remodel possible.

The community corrections office has also been expanded to accommodate three full time field officers. Come by and check out the changes. Everything looks great!

## Sober Link

Community Corrections has a new alcohol monitoring device that has been implemented in lieu of Mobile Breath. The portable alcohol monitoring device collects a breath sample to measure (BrAC) Breath Alcohol Concentration while simultaneously taking a photo of the individual to confirm their identity. The breathalyzer wirelessly submits the test results to a cloud based monitoring web portal where instant alerts can be set up to notify contacts if there are signs of relapse.

## Ignition Interlock

Ignition Interlock is now being used when ordered by the Court as a condition of a specialized driving privilege for those who have a suspended license. The interlock device is connected to the clients vehicle and a breath sample must be given before attempting to start the vehicle. If the driver's BAC is above the state required preset limit the vehicle will not start. Every ignition interlock device records the following information: BAC, date and time stamps, breath temperature, tampering, breath pressure, pass or failure of the test, GPS location, and picture.
