New Flag Football League begins at Palmer Park

mar Diaz and S t u a r t McGregor, both of whom have been involved and associated with youth sports in Miami for many years, have launched the new South Miami Youth Flag Football League (SMYFFL), which will follow the South Miami Youth Baseball League season schedule at Palmer Park.

"Winning and losing is something every young player should experience but winning is not the end-all of what sports are all about," said McGregor. "Our league is unique in that our mission statement is aimed at learning football skills and having fun. We work to maintain a competitive balance between our teams but also attempt to keep classmates, friends and family members together. This makes each game and practice a social occasion for parents and provides opportunities for car pooling and other scheduling that is helpful to parents as well."

Omar Diaz is well known in youth sports throughout Miami, having grown up here and attending area schools. He has been a Head Coach for the following organizations: Kendall Boy's & Girl's Club, SMYBL and Coral Gables Panthers.
