To the Board Members

Below is an email I am sending to Mr. Wagoner, and I wanted you all to see it and know the whys and wherefores about these issues that have surfaced.

### All False Accusations

Mr. Wagoner,

I was surprised when you refused to call me when I asked you to, instead saying you would talk to me at the meeting. Communication and responsibilities seems to have become an issue between us. Here are some of the issues I wanted to discuss with you.

This latest one you posted after I had asked you to call me ;

- The most recent incident was the information you posted on an Email about the Manager's Meeting. I don't know why you thought you had the authority to make the decisions about the meeting or to send the message, without even a call or email to me as President. - I have asked you to let me know information you get through the website as the Administrator, but nothing has ever come from you to me. Instead you take the information and determine what to do and say about it. You are a member of the Board and the Website Administrator and I certainly appreciate your work on the website, but that does not give you authority to speak on "behalf of the Board". Please stop taking that liberty.
- At our very first Board meeting I said to everyone "if you hear something that concerns this board, I want to know about it. Don't leave me in the dark." And I said I would do the same for the board members. But you seem to be ignoring that request and acting on your own.
- Concerning the issue of changing the number of games in order to save money, you decided it was appropriate to supersede the board meeting and hold court through emails, including calling for a vote on the issue. Board meetings are the format for discussions and votes so that everyone gets to participate at one time and have an exchange of ideas. The process of our CSS board is the same as for all boards. 1. the President makes an agenda for the meeting 2. if a board member wants something put on the agenda, they ask the President to put it on the agenda. Discussions and votes via email are only needed for emergency situations.
- You seem to be acting as person-in-charge, taking on roles that logically are for the President, or other officers. Right now I am the President and I hope you can support me, working together on the board for the good of CSSC.
