Our original fields were at Five Mile and Lake Hazel by Paul's Market. It was a nice setup with convenient parking at the bowling alley. In the mid-2000's, the land our fields sat on was sold for development and the league lost its fields. Today those old fields are a subdivision.

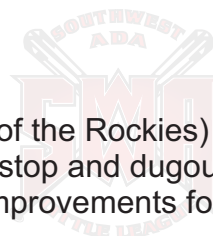


The need for fields drove us to Lake Hazel Middle School where there were existing backstops, but no usable infields. Between 2006 and 2009, with fundraiser dollars, SWA gradually built infields, added dugouts, expanded backstops and fences, and built the batting cages at LHMS. After taking a break at LHMS to work on CCOG, we've returned to investing in LHMS with the addition of storage sheds, grass infields, and a new snack shack in recent years.



The growing numbers of younger players led to us partnering with Cloverdale Church of God to develop fields on the vacant lot south of the Church to serve T-ball and Prep-minor. Using fundraiser dollars over several years, a barren goathead patch has been transformed into the lush facility you see below.





Our growing softball program led to us partnering with Amity Methodist (now Cathedral of the Rockies) to build an exclusive home for softball in 2010. Using fundraiser dollars, SWA built a backstop and dugouts and installed a skinned infield. Continued improvements have happened with dugout improvements for the 2017 season.
