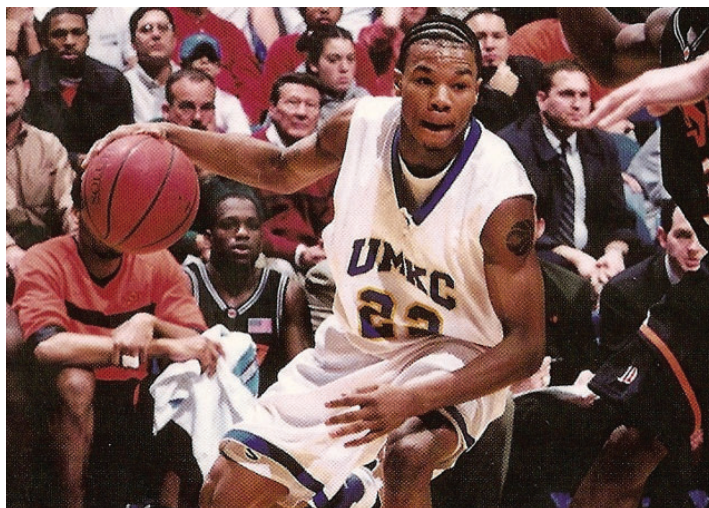

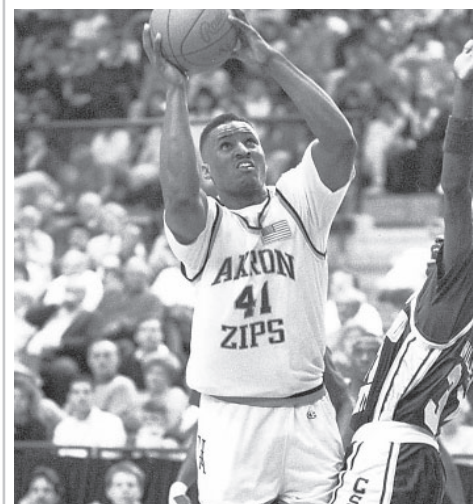

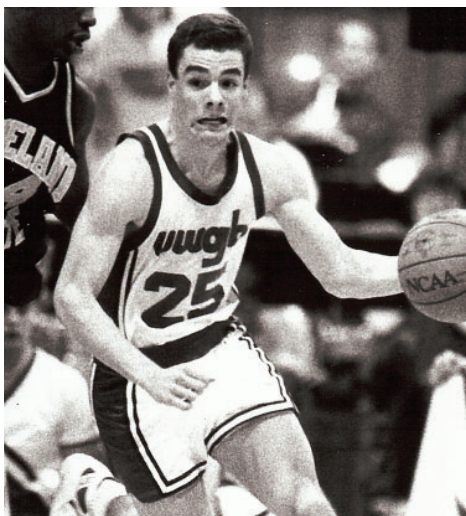


Oakland's Mike Helms set a league record by averaging 26.86 points per game in 2002-03.

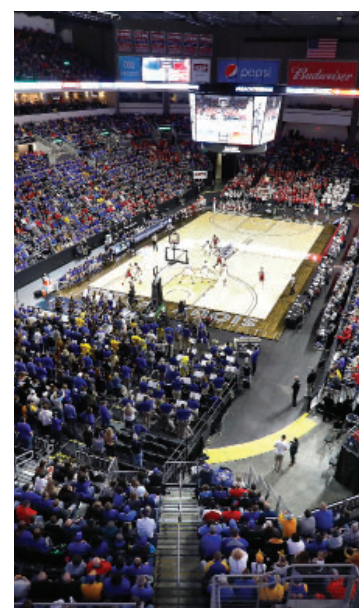
