David Sabatini steps down at Whitehead Institute over sexual harassment reports Sabatini remains professor at MIT;

senior administration response may include the revocation of tenure

David Sabatini, MIT biology professor, resigned as a Whitehead Institute member Aug. 20. He was further terminated from his employment as an investigator at the Howard Hughes Medical Institute (HHMI). Sabatini remains a tenured professor at MIT but has been placed on administrative leave according to his MIT Biology profile.

Whitehead Director Ruth Lehmann announced Sabatini's resignation in an email to staff Aug. 20. Sabatini "is no longer associated with either the Whitehead" or the HHMI, "effective immediately."

Sabatini's departure comes after an investigation found he "violated" the Whitehead's "policies on sexual harassment" and others "unrelated to research misconduct," Lehmann wrote.

Todd Golub, director of the Broad Institute, wrote in an email to staff Aug. 21 that Sabatini has also been placed "on leave at the Broad, where he is a senior associate member."

According to Lehmann's email, a "Diversity, Equity and Inclusion survey commissioned and conducted last winter" that "collected data and comments on the culture" across the

Whitehead "identified issues of particular concern in the Sabatini Lab." Hinkley Allen & Snyder LLP was appointed to investigate the lab.

Lehmann added that Sabatini's departure has "significant implications for the 39 members of his lab," where four are "HHMI employees" and "the remainder are Whitehead employees." "Whitehead human resources personnel will be conducting one-on-one meetings" with all 39 members to "help effectuate a plan to ensure their smooth transition to another lab setting so that they may continue their work in pursuit of their career goals."

MIT's News Office wrote in an email to The Tech that MIT takes "complaints regarding harassment seriously" and that the "senior administration is reviewing the report and determining next steps in response to these findings, up to and including revocation of tenure proceedings.

Sabatini has been funded by the HMMI since 2008, according to HHMI's profile on Sabatini. He is also a member of the Koch Institute for Integrative Cancer Research, member of the National Academy of Sciences, and research professor at the American Cancer Society. It is unclear if he still maintains these positions since the reports.

MIT Welcome Center set to open on Sept. 7 near Kendall Square In-person tours and information sessions to resume this fall

MIT will open its new welcome center Sept. 7. The center will be located in Kendall Square on the first floor of Building E38 of Site 4.

The MIT Welcome Center is a gift of Tina and Hamid Moghadam (SB 1977, SM 1978) and will serve as a place for visitors to attend information sessions, take campus tours, and receive maps and guidance about visiting.

Director of Communications of the Office of the Executive Vice President and Treasurer Jennifer Burke wrote in an email to The Tech that MIT will begin holding in-person campus tours and information sessions "later in September" while also continuing to hold online admission information sessions.

Burke wrote that the welcome center will be the first time that MIT provides "a dedicated space to welcome prospective students and their families." The center has a 200-seat audi-

torium where information sessions for prospective students will take place and where campus tours will

Burke added that the welcome center will "broadly support the needs of both visitors and Cambridge community members for wayfinding and informational services about the campus and the lo-

The new center is near the inbound Kendall/MIT MBTA stop.

Design of E38, where the welcome center is located, took place from 2015 to 2017, "following a period of exploration and community engagement," Burke wrote. Construction of the building began in 2017 and ended in 2020.

Inside, visitors will find a range of visual elements that showcase the Institute's collaborative, eclectic, and lively culture, including an installation by MIT's Borderline artists, inspired by the phrase, "Here at MIT ..."



Extended Forecast


Today: Heavy rain and breezy. High around 70°F (21°C). North winds 16-22 mph, up to 34 mph.

Tonight: A slight chance of showers, then partly cloudy. Low around 57°F (14°C). Winds in the northwest, up to 9 mph.


Tomorrow: Mostly sunny and clear. High around 70°F (21°C) and low around 58°F (14°C). Winds in the northwest, around 7-10 mph.

Situation for Noon Eastern Time, Thursday, September 2, 2021








