

My Approach

Process all projects in the Key of C. I teach in this order: 17 LH patterns + walking transitions 8 RH Licks with several variations each

1. LH Shuffle Patterns (p. 23)

- o Label each pattern (bottom p. 23) A through F
- o Run each pattern through LH independence exercise on p. 30-31

2. RH Lick #1

- Label the licks 1A through 1H for easy reference
- Practice one lick at a time as follows:
 - Play through the 12BB with <u>LH Shuffle Pattern A</u> (written out in the book see Track 27)
 - Try with some or all of the other <u>LH Shuffle Patterns</u>

3. LH Boogie Woogie Patterns (p. 24)

- Label each pattern A through H
- o Run each pattern through LH independence exercise on p. 30-31

4. RH Lick #1 Mastery

- Random choice of RH #1 Licks played with random choice of <u>LH Shuffle or</u> <u>Boogie Pattern</u>
- I create wheels for RH and LH using wheelofnames.com spin each wheel to determine which RH and LH to play

5. RH Lick #2

- o Label the licks 2A 2D as before
- Practice one lick at a time with LH Shuffle Patterns and LH Boogie Woogie patterns

6. RH Lick #2 Mastery

- Random choice of RH #2 Licks played with random choice of <u>LH Shuffle or</u> <u>Boogie Pattern</u>
- Add a RH #2 Licks wheel for review

7. LH Walking Patterns (p. 25-26)

o Run each pattern through LH independence exercise on p. 30-31

8. Comprehensive Review Licks 1 & 2

- o Random RH Lick with random LH pattern
- Wheel 1 includes:
 - RH Licks 1A through 1H
 - RH Licks 2A through 2D
 - (Optional) RH only from "In the style of...." pages
- O Wheel 2 includes:
 - LH Shuffle Patterns A F
 - LH Boogie Woogie Patterns A H
 - LH Walking Patterns A C
- Spend as much time on these random combinations as necessary

9. RH Lick #3 as before

Label, practice with various LH patterns

10. LH Walking Bass Transitions (p. 26 - 28)

- CP Squidgies Boogie FL6
- These aren't labeled as they can be used at your discretion with any pattern
- Practice with any RH chords (CAGE, 9th, Bishop St., 13th, etc. CP Blues & Improv Program, Project 12)

11. Comprehensive Review Licks 1, 2 & 3

- Random RH Lick with random LH pattern
- Wheel 1 includes:
 - All RH Licks learned
 - (Optional) RH only from "In the style of...." pages
- Wheel 2 includes:
 - ALL LH patterns
- Spend as much time on these random combinations as necessary

12. Next Steps

- o Continue in the same manner until all RH Licks have been learned
 - Add each subsequent RH Lick as before
 - Comprehensive Review (randomly selecting from ALL RH Licks and ALL LH Patterns)
- The remaining chapters may be used as you see fit read through them!
- Projects may be processed in different keys as developmentally appropriate; I
 go through <u>everything</u> in the Key of C first

NOTE: Chapter 13 Turnarounds, Breaks, Intros & Endings may be introduced at any point, or it can wait until you've completed all the RH Licks.

Additional Suggestions

- You may choose at any point to explore some of the information in Chapter 1, e.g.
 - o "Slow change" vs. "fast change" 12BB (p. 12)
 - Find examples of both in Foundation blues pieces
 - o Review chords p. 14 17
 - o Major vs minor blues scale (p. 18-19)
 - Other blues forms (p. 20-21)
