Why Requirements Matter

- Requirements ensure consistency and quality in student progress.
- Establishing clear expectations from the start reduces misunderstandings and increases retention.

The Baking Analogy

Meeting specific requirements is essential for success in music education.

Studio Requirements Overview

Effective Communication:

- Discuss studio policies and requirements at the Free Introductory Session (FIS).
- Clear communication upfront prevents future issues and ensures higher retention.

Suggested Key Requirements:

- 1. Parental Involvement:
 - A parent must attend and participate in the lesson.
 - A parent must protect and supervise their child's practice time.
- 2. Attendance and Make-Up Policy:
 - No make-up lessons. Students must find out what was covered from peers if they miss a lesson.
 - Punctuality is essential; arrive on time and stay for the entire lesson.
- 3. Materials and Payment:
 - Purchase and use Student Home Materials.

- Enrollment in Autopay is mandatory. 4. Year-Round Learning: - Lessons continue throughout the year, including summer. **Activity: Reflect and Improve** Reflect on Current Studio Functioning: - Take 3-4 minutes to write down everything that is going well. - Share these positives with the group. Identify Areas for Improvement: - Take 3-4 minutes to consider one or two things that could make your studio operate better. - Share these ideas with the group. **Requirement-Based Teaching Effective Instruction** - Give clear instructions instead of requests. - Example: Instead of saying, "Will you please bring your playlist next week?" say, "Be sure to bring your playlist next week."

Consistency in Expectations

- Ensure that students understand and adhere to your requirements consistently.
- Rephrase and reinforce instructions as needed to maintain authority and clarity.

Say what you mean and mean what you say.
