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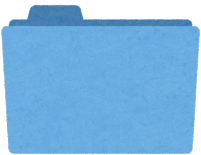

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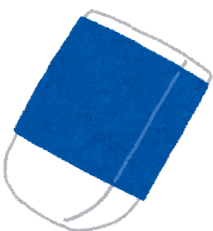

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※1 ファ, フィ, フェ, フォ are used to transcribe [f] in English and other languages. However, the pronunciation is not the same as [f]. [f] is a sound made by touching the upper teeth to the lower lip, while ファ etc. are made by getting both lips closer. We use provisionally [hw] to transcribe this sound. Similarly, we use フ for [fu] in the borrowed words. In this case also, our pronunciation is not [f]. Since [f] and [hw] are the similar sounds, you can substitute [f] for [hw]. However, please notice [f] is a substitute, not the sound we actually pronounce.
