

## Supply list Hand Sculpting in Porcelain

Porcelain-clay, the exact type depends on your way of firing. The suppliers for ceramicists are mostly very helpful to advise you.



Sculpting tool

Clay roller

Sculpting brush

Hollowing tool (mirette)



Knife

Styrofoam egg (I prefer 2,75 inch / 7 cm)



Pin

Vegetable oil

Water pot

Damp cloth (to cover product and clay and to wipe your hands)

Tube or stand to support the neck



Plastic wrap

Large brushes

Porcelain-kiln or pottery-kiln with a minimum temperature of 1220 degrees Celsius (about 2230 degrees Fahrenheit). Preferably higher



This is what my kiln looks like. You load it from the top. My kiln works with a kiln sitter and I fire my porcelain with cone 6. There are also kilns with a built-in computer to set the temperature.

If you don't have a kiln (yet), look around for someone who can fire for you. That can be a person but it also could be a craft center.
