2 3 4 5 6	A RESOLUTION introduced by Councilmembers Clark Duffy and John Nave relating to the use of the proceeds from the proposed increase in franchise fees on electrical, natural gas and transported gas within the City of Topeka.
7	WHEREAS, the City of Topeka currently receives a franchise fee in the amount of
8	three percent (3%) of the gross revenue from the sale of natural gas energy in the City of
9	Topeka by Kansas Gas Service under the terms of Ordinance No. 15667 which granted a
10	franchise for the transmission and distribution of natural gas in the City of Topeka to
11	Kansas Power and Light Company which franchise is now held by Kansas Gas Services;
12	and
13	WHEREAS, the City of Topeka currently receives a franchise fee in the amount of
14	three percent (3%) of the gross revenue from the sale of electric energy in the City of
15	Topeka by Westar Energy, Inc. under the terms of Ordinance No. 15667 which granted a
16	franchise for the transmission and distribution of electrical energy in the City of Topeka to
17	Kansas Power and Light Company which franchise is now held by Westar Energy, Inc.;
18	and
19	WHEREAS, franchise fee payments compensate the City of Topeka for permitting
20	the utilities to place their facilities in the City of Topeka's right-of-way, maximizing the City's
21	return on it's real estate assets; and
22	WHEREAS, the placement of utility facilities in these City of Topeka's rights-of-way
23	and easements benefits the utilities and their ratepayers by allowing the utilities to use
24	these tax-exempt properties at an annual cost of approximately six million eight hundred

thousand dollars (\$6,800,000.00) in franchise fees (if increased), while the acquisition of

26	the equivalent in taxable private property required to conduct their business would cost the
27	utilities and their ratepayers approximately eighty million dollars (\$80,000,000.00); and
28	WHEREAS, the City of Topeka's main revenue source is from ad valorem property
29	tax; and
30	WHEREAS, because of state property tax exemptions, the owners of approximately
31	seventy percent (70%) of the properties in the City of Topeka pay one hundred percent
32	(100%) of the property taxes that support the city services provided to all the residents and
33	businesses in the City of Topeka; and
34	WHEREAS, franchise fees are paid by all consumers of the franchised entity
35	including those customers that are otherwise exempt from property tax; and
36	WHEREAS, an increase in franchise fees allows the City of Topeka to enhance non
37	property tax revenue sources, and thus provides the City of Topeka with the means to fund
38	city services in order to maintain and enhance the quality of life in the community; and
39	WHEREAS, an increase in franchise fees allows the City of Topeka to do its part as
40	a tax levying entity in stabilizing the property tax burden in the city; and
41	WHEREAS, the City of Topeka was able to benefit from the refunding of previously
42	issued general obligation debt of the City of Topeka during the 2003 calendar year; and
43	WHEREAS, the City of Topeka used two million three hundred fifty thousand dollars
44	(\$2,350,000.00) of those savings to reduce the ad valorem tax of the City of Topeka in the
45	2004 calendar year; and
46	WHEREAS, the City of Topeka expects to receive approximately three million dollars
47	(\$3,000,000.00) in additional revenue from the proposed increase in franchise fees

imposed on the sale of electricity, natural gas, and transported natural gas, within the boundaries of the City of Topeka, in calendar year 2005 and beyond.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Topeka, Kansas, that the City Council should explore the increase of franchise fees as a means of enhancing non property tax revenue sources and stabilizing the tax levies in the City of Topeka; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Topeka, Kansas, that it is the intent of the City Council of the City of Topeka, to utilize the proceeds from the increased franchise fees in the General Fund, to offset the "one time" savings realized in calendar year 2004, and mill levy transferred from the General Bond and Interest Fund, resulting from the 2003 refunding of a portion of the City's general obligation debt.
