January 25, 1982

The meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Corydon was called to order by Fred Cammack, Chairman. Those forming the quorum were Ardis Conrad, Ray Bussabarger, Floyd Byerley and Fred Cammack. Dennis Evans was absent.

The minutes for the December 28, 1981 meeting and the January 14, 1982 meeting were read. Ray Bussabarger made a motion to approve the minutes of both meetings and Ardis Conrad seconded.

Attorney David Layson was present, representing Lester Melton. He asked the Board to make a motion on the amending of the Zoning Ordinance concerning Mr. Melton's property at 600 E. Walnut. He had requested a change to R-2 in order to make a house into a duplex. The Planning Commission had denied the request at their December meeting and their January meeting. Mr. Layson asked the Board to override the Planning Commission. Ardis Conrad made a motion to deny the zoning change request. Floyd Byerley seconded. There were three ayes and 1 abstention. Change denied.

The Board decided to make a revision in the vacation policy. The policy will be as follows:

Effective January 25, 1982, all employees of the Town of Corydon will receive vacations as set forth below:

- (1) week of vacation annually after (1) year of continuous service.
- (2) weeks of vacation annually after (3) years of continuous service.
- (3) weeks of vacation annually after (15) years of continuous service.

All employees must notify the Clerk-Treasurer during the week prior to the requested week to receive payment for their vacation.

Any employee planning to carry over vacation from one calendar year to the next calendar year must have prior approval from the Board of Trustees.

Any employee planning to take (3) consecutive weeks of vacation must have prior approval from the Board of Trustees.

Prior to beginning vacation, supervisors should designate someone in their department to assume responsibility and notify the Board of Trustees.

Floyd Byerley made a motion to adopt the revision and Ardis Conrad seconded. Motion carried.

Bills and claims were signed.

Floyd Byerley made a motion to adjourn the meeting and Ray Bussabarger seconded. Meeting adjourned.

March 22, 1982

The meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Town of Corydon was called to order by Fred Cammack, Chairman. Those forming the quorum were Ardis Conrad, Floyd Byerley, Dennis Evans, Ray Bussabarger and Fred Cammack.

The minutes were read by the Board. Dennis Evans made a motion to approve the minutes and Ardis Conrad seconded. Minutes approved.

Ben Daniel of 320 W. Chestnut St. was present concerning erosion of his land on the Indian Creek bank due to the flow of the Creek. He said he has lost about 4 or 5 feet of his property in the last 2 years. He was asking if the Town could do anything to help keep anymore of the bank from eroding. They discussed rip rapping, building a retainer wall, and contacting the Corps of Engineers. The Board and Mr. Daniels agreed to contact the Corps of Engineers and see if they could give us any suggestions on what to do. No action was taken by the Board pending hearing from the Corps of Engineers.

Paul Primavera was present to see if he could get a parking place reserved for a radiator shop that is opening up in his building at Chestnut and Mulberry St. Mr. Cammack told him there would be a charge of \$10.00 per month and they would have to supply their own signs. Mr. Primavera said he would have the owner of the radiator shop come before the Town Board for permission to have the spot. No action was taken at this time.

Kenneth Miles was reappointed to the Corydon Housing Authority for a 4 year term effective February 8, 1982. Dennis Evans made a motion to reappoint him and Ray Bussabarger seconded. Motion carried.

There was a discussion on a claim by Darlene Johnson for a compactor drawer liner that was mistakenly taken by the Town garbage men when they were picking up the trash. Ardis Conrad suggested that since she was negligent in putting out the liner, and we were negligent in picking it up that the cost be split in half. Ardis Conrad made a motion that we offer to pay \$15.94, which is half of the \$31.87 bill. Dennis Evans seconded. John Bussabarger is to inform Mrs. Johnson of this decision. The Board also noted that this was not to be confused with a regular garbage container. Motion carried.

There was an uncollectable account on the Albert Wiseman account at 721 Higdon St. J. D. Williams, Town Attorney, was instructed to take it to Small Claims Court. The amount is \$31.90. A bill for the Old Capitol Pub for \$25.87 for damage to a meter lid with a sledge hammer and a bill for a frozen meter at the Lincoln Hills Car Wash owned by William Heishman were also given to Mr. Williams to collect in Small Claims Court. Dennis Evans made a motion to this effect and Ray Bussabarger seconded. Motion carried.

Bills and claims were signed.

Floyd Byerley made a motion to adjourn and Ray Bussabarger seconded. Meeting adjourned.
