## DISCRETIONARY ORDER NO. W-10, REVISED JULY 1976

#### RABBIT

WHEREAS, it has been determined after thorough investigation that a limited season for the taking of rabbit is feasible; and

WHEREAS, said determination has been based on data relative to the welfare of rabbits, their relationship to other animals; and the welfare of the people;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Joseph D. Cloud, Director of the Department of Natural Resources, acting pursuant to the authority of the Acts of 1969, Chapter 70, as found in the Indiana Code 1971, 14-2-3-3; and having given notice and held a public hearing as required by the Acts of 1945, Chapter 120, as found in the Indiana Code 1971, 4-22-2, hereby make the following order to be known as Discretionary Order No. W-10.

#### CLOSED SEASON

 It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt, take, possess, sell, offer to purchase, or to ship, transport, carry, or deliver or receive for shipment, transportation, or carriage in any manner beyond the limits of this state any rabbit or any part thereof, except as otherwise may be provided by law.

### OPEN SEASON AND GENERAL PROVISIONS

- The open season for hunting, taking and possessing rabbits, except as otherwise provided by law, shall start at 9 A.M. Eastern Standard Time on the opening day and shall extend from the first Friday of November through 31 January.
- 3. The open season for hunting, taking and possessing rabbits within the boundaries of Atterbury, Crosley, Glendale, Jasper-Pulaski, Kingsbury, LaSalle, Patoka, Pigeon River, Tri-County, Willow Slough and Winamac Fish and Wildlife Areas shall extend from 1 October through 31 January.
- 4. No person shall take more than five (5) wild rabbits in any one (1) day and shall not have in his possession, or ship, carry or transport in this State more than ten (10) wild rabbits dead or alive after two (2) days of lawful hunting, or at anytime thereafter, whether such rabbits were shot, killed or captured by such persons or acquired in any other manner in this State or any other State and brought into this State.
- No person or persons shall take rabbits from or by means of a motor-driven conveyance.

THIS ORDER SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE FIFTEEN (15) DAYS AFTER RECEIPT BY COUNTY CLERK AND REMAIN IN FORCE AND EFFECT UNTIL RESCINDED OR MODIFIED ACCORDING TO LAW.
