2019 in Review

More than 8,500 TMMC Team Members work hard every day to safely produce the highest quality vehicles. 2019 was a transformational year at TMMC. First in February we said goodbye to the Corolla that helped launch the plant back in 1986, and then in April we announced that we will add the Lexus NX to our production starting in 2022. This will make TMMC the first plant outside of Japan to build two Lexus vehicles and is a great honour, earned through the efforts of our hard-working Team Members. In 2019 we achieved better safety results than ever before and we were recognized with two plant quality awards, one of which was Platinum, for best quality in the world.

In 2019, every single week day we built approximately 1,500 Toyota Corolla and RAV4 vehicles and 400 Lexus RX 350 and 450h vehicles. TMMC once again was the top vehicle producer amongst all of Toyota's North American manufacturing facilities, with the Toyota RAV4 and Lexus RX sales both leading in their segments. TMMC North Plant in Cambridge switched over to Toyota New Global Architecture (TNGA) – new manufacturing processes and technology – to support the next generation RAV4 vehicles we started building there in early 2019. In Woodstock, we added the hybrid model of the new RAV4 to our production, which has proved to be extremely popular with customers, keeping TMMC Team Members busy building as fast as we can.

Dedicated to Safety

Our vehicles are safer and more reliable than ever. So is the way we work. Safe work is the foundation of everything we do, and we believe that zero injuries is achievable. At TMMC our vision is to be the safest auto plant in North America and to be a company where Team Members know that their careers and their well-being can be sustained.

Proud Member of our Community

Toyota around the world believes in giving back to the communities in which it does business. At TMMC, we support our community through donations, sponsorship, and volunteerism. In 2019, we sponsored the Cambridge Tour de Grand, which provides bicycle safety training and advocates helmet use, and the Cambridge YMCA Jingle Bell Run, raising funds to help more than 600 kids thrive with the support of community, access to resources, healthy lifestyles, safe spaces, strong adult role models, and a sense of belonging.

- Sponsoring Let's Talk Science, an educational program bringing science, technology, engineering, and math to local students.
- Supporting a major expansion at South Gate Centre in Oxford County, offering programs and support for older adults.

At TMMC, we're committed to environmental sustainability—reducing, reusing, and recycling wherever possible. When you can build approximately 500,000 vehicles every year, you would think there would be significant waste or environmental impact. Not at TMMC! In 2004, TMMC set a goal of sending zero waste to landfill. Starting in 2006, we met that goal through comprehensive recycling, reusing, reducing, and composting programs. We continue to set new environmental goals every year—raising the bar for manufacturing operations and are working towards the Toyota Environmental Challenge 2050. The Toyota Environmental Challenge 2050 means we are striving to reduce the environmental burden attributed to automobiles to as close to zero as possible, while developing measures to contribute positively to the earth and its societies with the aim of achieving a sustainable society.

Toyota has an ambitious goal: to help everyone get where they want and need to be, in part with the great vehicles we build at TMMC. We are proud of what we do, and we continue to grow, keeping ahead of the curve. In 2019, TMMC was recognized by our customers for quality with both a world-best Platinum and a Bronze JD Power & Associates Plant Quality Award, for our North and South Plants respectively, and a vehicle segment award for the Lexus RX we build. TMMC retains the title of the plant that has won more of these quality awards than any other plant in the Americas. In 2019, we celebrated being recognized as one of Canada's Top 100 Employers, Waterloo Area's Top Employers, Canada's Greenest Employers, Canada's Top Family-Friendly Employers, and Canada's Best Diversity Employers.
