
Have you heard about the exciting developments across the street from TPAC? That's what I most want to share with you today.

We are so proud of recent improvements here and so enthusiastic about upcoming plans for this important civic venue, which was dedicated in 1925 to honor the Tennesseans who served our country in World War I. Did you know the Grand Ole Opry performed there from 1939 to 1943 (and again following the 2010 flood)? Other celebrated artists who appeared there in the 20th century included Ray Charles, Bette Davis, Charlie Daniels, David Bowie, KISS, Willie Nelson, Waylon Jennings, Barry Manilow, Greg Allman, and hundreds more. Buddy Guy and Jonny Lang are playing March 1, 2013, in a concert billed as "One Night: Two Guitar Legends."

And then, an exclusive Nashville experience, there's The Attic Sessions, an eclectic series of short films featuring music and interviews, notable local artists among them.

In short, TPAC staff share passion for this place – the storied history, the perfect acoustics, the sheer beauty, and the tremendous potential. 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


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



DANNY YOUNG (*Drums*) is a NY-based drummer who has toured with *Young Frankenstein*, the hair band Nelson, and most recently played/wrote the drum book for the new Jerry Lewis musical *The Nutty Professor*.

GREEN DAY (Music & Lyrics) – vocalist/guitarist BILLIE JOE ARMSTRONG (Book & Lyrics), bassist Mike Dirnt, and drummer Tré Cool – were kids from working-class backgrounds who came of age in the underground punk scene in Berkeley. Even though they had released two records prior (1039 / Smoothed Out Slappy Hours and Kerplunk), they announced their arrival with 1994's Dookie, a dynamic blast of exuberant punkpop that sold 15 million copies and earned the band its first Grammy® Award for Best Alternative Music Performance. Over the years, Green Day continued to top the charts with their subsequent studio albums Insomniac, Nimrod and Warning, while entertaining millions of fans with their frenetic live shows. But it was

their landmark 2004 album American Idiot that launched Green Day into the stratosphere. American Idiot debuted at No. 1 on the Billboard chart, spawned five hit singles, earned seven Grammy® nominations (winning two, including Best Rock Album), and raised the bar for modern rock and roll. In 2009, Green Day released 21st Century Breakdown, which won a 2010 Grammy® Award for Best Rock Album. It spawned two hit singles: the gold "Know Your Enemy," which was the first song ever to top Billboard's Rock, Alternative, and Mainstream Rock charts simultaneously, and the double-platinum "21 Guns," which earned them three 2009 MTV Video Music Awards including Best Rock Video. Green Day also took home an American Music Award for Favorite Alternative Rock Music Artist. Later that year, Green Day collaborated with Tony Award winning director of Spring Awakening, Michael Mayer, for the stage musical of American Idiot. The play bowed at the Berkeley Repertory Theatre in September 2009 and set attendance records during its limited engagement. The play went on to Broadway and ran for a year at the St. James Theatre and won two Tony Awards. Their highly anticipated album *iUno!*, the first in a trilogy of new releases, will bow this fall followed by iDos! and iTré!. For more about the band, visit www.greenday.com.

Other choreography and movement director credits include Once (Lortel Award - Outstanding Choreography, Broadway, ART, Boston, & New York Theatre Workshop), Peter & the Starcatcher (Lortel Award - Outstanding Choreography, Broadway and NYTW) Dr Dee (Manchester International Festival) The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night Time, Dido Queen of Carthage, The Hothouse and Market Boy (Royal National Theatre); Hunter, 365, The Bacchae and The Wolves In The Wall (National Theatre of Scotland). TOM KITT (Arrangements / Orchestrations) is the composer and co-orchestrator of next to normal, for which

Tom is also the composer of High Fidelity, Bring It On: The Musical (with Lin-Manuel Miranda), All's Well That Ends Well and The Winters Tale (NYSF), From Up Here (MTC), and The Retributionists (Playwrights Horizons). As a musical director, conductor, arranger and orchestrator, credits include Pitch Perfect (Feature Film), 13, Debbie Does Dallas, Everyday Rapture, Hair, Laugh Whore and Urban Cowboy. Tom provided additional arrangements for Green Day's Grammywinning album 21st Century Breakdown and their most recent albums, iUno! iDos! iTré!

CHRISTINE JONES (Scenic Designer) won the 2010 Tony Award for her work on American Idiot. She earned a Tony nomination for Spring Awakening, directed by Michael Mayer. Also with Mayer she designed On A Clear Day, and Everyday Rapture. Her Off-Broadway credits include Coraline, music by Stephin Merritt, and The Book of Longing, by Leonard Cohen with music by Philip Glass. Jones teaches at NYU and is the artistic director of Theatre for One, a space designed for one performer and one audience member, which can be seen at theatreforone.com.
