

#### The past, present, and future often intersect on stage.

For thousands of years, the performing arts have been a blend of time-honored traditions and contemporary expressions.

So, too, the tried, true and new are reflected in the way that TPAC interacts with patrons before and after that moment in time when the artists on the stage are interrelating with the audience.

In just over a decade, the number of TPAC tickets sold on the internet has gone from nil to nearly 99,000 a season – a figure that increases more rapidly each year.

"We'll continue to use traditional communications, but you'll see ongoing rapid growth in 'business intelligence' at TPAC – all of the satellite and electronic technologies

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


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
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
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
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
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
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Accessibility Services at TPAC include parking; elevators; wheelchair seating; use of a TPAC wheelchair; designated restrooms; and services for hearing and visually impaired patrons. Infrared assisted listening devices are available at no charge at the entrance to each theater. TPAC offers signing for hearing impaired patrons, and audio description and Braille programs for blind and visually impaired patrons on the Sunday matinee in the HCA/TriStar Broadway at TPAC Series.
