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
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
























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
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
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chronicles the remarkable life journey of Dr. Ming Wang, a world-renowned laser eye surgeon and philanthropist.

As a teenager, Ming fought valiantly to escape one of history's darkest eras - China's Cultural Revolution – during which millions of innocent youth were deported to remote areas to face a life sentence of poverty and hard labor. Through his own tenacity and his parents' tireless efforts to provide a chance of freedom for their son, Ming eventually made his way to America with \$50 in his pocket and an American dream in his heart, where against all odds he would earn a PhD in laser physics and graduate magna cum laude with the highest honors from Harvard Medical School and MIT. He embraced his Christian faith and tackled one of the most important questions of our time - Are faith and science friends or foes? - which led to his invention of a breakthrough biotechnology to restore sight.



To date, Dr. Wang has performed over 55,000 eye procedures and has treated patients from nearly every state in the U.S. and from over 55 countries worldwide. He is considered the "doctor's doctor," as he has operated on over 4,000 physicians. Dr. Wang has published 8 textbooks, holds several U.S. patents and performed the world's first laser artificial cornea implantation. He is currently the only surgeon in the state who performs 3D LASIK (age 18+), 3D Forever Young Lens Surgery (age 45+),

3D Laser Kamra (age 45+) and 3D Laser Cataract Surgery (age 60+). He established a non-profit foundation which provides sight restoration surgeries for indigent patients who otherwise would never have the opportunity to receive them free-of-charge.

This is a story of one man's inspirational journey, of turning fear, poverty, persecution and prejudice into healing and love for others. It demonstrates how focus, determination, humility and profound faith can inspire a life that, in turn, impacts that of countless others.

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

BULLETS OVER BROADWAY Synopsis

ACT I

In New York City, it's the time of Prohibition and just before the crash in 1929. It's the time of flappers, jazz, bathtub gin, and pistolpacking gangsters. At mob boss Nick Valenti's club, a speakeasy in midtown Manhattan, the gorgeous Atta-Girls are in full swing. Among them is Olive Neal, Nick's burlesque dancer girlfriend who yearns for the big part in a Broadway show he has promised but not yet delivered. On a Greenwich Village apartment rooftop, we meet David Shayne, a playwright and self-proclaimed "serious artist" and Ellen, his long-suffering girlfriend of 10 years. His new play has been turned down by every producer except Julian Marx, who calls to say that he has a single backer interested in producing his play - Nick Valenti. There's just one catch: David has to find a part in his play for Olive. Meanwhile, Ellen asks David that, if the play is not a success, they can move back to Pittsburgh, get married and have "a real life." As David contemplates her proposal, a pack of Nick Valenti's gangsters shoot it out across town with members of a rival gang. David and Julian visit Olive to discuss her role in the play and she demonstrates her singular ability. David is appalled but realizes he has to compromise for his art. Julian then pays a visit to the aging Broadway diva Helen Sinclair to persuade her to play the lead role in David's play. At first, she rejects Julian's offer, but then agrees to compromise with certain contractual demands. Meanwhile, Cheech, a hitman in the service of Nick Valenti, escorts a hit down to the Gowanus Canal and "takes care" of him on Valenti's orders. It's now the first day of rehearsals and the cast gathers to read the script out loud. Olive's flawlessly untalented interpretation is a shock to everyone. Cheech, who has been hired to guard Olive, offers David some astute suggestions for improving the script. As the cast begins to bond, Olive catches the eye of Warner Purcell, an aging and engorging Broadway actor. David quickly falls for Helen, who cagily uses his infatuation to her advantage on stage. In celebration of his birthday, Ellen arranges for a night out at Nick's club. While on the dance floor, David bumps into Cheech and they have another heated conversation on how to improve the play. The next day, during a break in rehearsals, David has second thoughts about passing off Cheech's significant rewrites to his script as his own. At Penn Station, the Red Caps sing as the cast hurries to board a train heading to their out-of-town tryout in Boston. Cheech continues to write, Warner and Olive continue their affair, David continues to be in awe of his leading lady, and Ellen begins to get suspicious of her flancé.

ACT II

In Boston, the cast is overjoyed by the daily improvement of what they don't know is now more and more Cheech's script. As the celebration continues, Cheech confronts Warner about his romantic involvement with Olive. Helen, impressed by the rewrites, warms to David. On the train back to New York, and on a high from the excellent reviews for the play, David decides he will tell Ellen about his affair with Helen. After arriving back in New York, Cheech realizes that Olive is ruining his work and decides to take matters into his own hands. After rehearsals, Cheech takes Olive for a drive to the Gowanus Canal. He tells her she's "a terrible actress" and does her in. Meanwhile, back in Greenwich Village, David explains to Ellen that he has fallen for Helen. Ellen surprises him right back by letting him know that she is also with someone new, and David is devastated. To make matters worse, he gets a phone call saying Olive's body has been found in the Gowanus Canal. David is horrified. Flash forward to opening night! Olive's understudy is preparing to go on and Nick has figured out that Cheech is the one who killed Olive. As the performance goes on, Nick's gangsters

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Nashville's War Memorial Auditorium

Celebrates 90 Years with Unveiling of Historic Marker at 7th and Union

Dedicated after War World I, the auditorium has served as center for Nashville's military, political, and musical history.

"The War Memorial Auditorium is one of Tennessee's finest public spaces. The intent of the architect and builders was to enrich Nashville for generations to come, and today the building is as vibrant and valuable as when it opened in 1925."

Ninety years ago, the War Memorial Auditorium was dedicated as a monument to the thousands of Tennesseans who fought and died in World War I. In the decades since, the elegant acoustic hall has served as the backdrop for some of the region's most significant military, political, and musical history.


To celebrate this occasion, a delegation from Nashville's arts and history communities led by Tennessee Governor Bill Haslam gathered to unveil a historical marker approved by the Tennessee Historical Commission and planned for the storied intersection of 7th Avenue and Union Street.

The historical marker highlights the auditorium's design, Leopold and Belle Kinney Scholz's gilded bronze statue of "Victory" in the central courtyard, and the venue's role as home to the Nashville Symphony (1925-1980) and the world-famous Grand Ole Opry (1939-1943). During the auditorium's time hosting the Opry, The King of Country Music Roy Acuff became a regular performer, and legends like Bill Monroe, Ernest Tubb, and Minnie Pearl were inducted. The Opry later moved to the Ryman Auditorium, and the Symphony moved to TPAC in 1980, becoming one of its first resident companies.

Originally seating 2,200 and featuring excellent acoustics, the auditorium's role in Nashville's music scene expanded over time. In the 1950s, it served as a frequent stop on the African American Theater Circuit and brought artists such as Ray Charles, The Five Satins, and Bo Diddley to Nashville audiences.

Later, fans experienced legendary performances by Bette Davis, Liberace, Elton John, David Bowie performing as "Ziggy Stardust," Bette Midler, Billy Joel, the first Charlie "This 90th anniversary, I am proud to recognize this beautiful iconic building which suitably reflects Tennessee's proud past and is beloved for its historic relevance, cultural impact, as well as the memories it evokes. Like many in Tennessee, I too treasure the War Memorial Auditorium as the setting for warmly remembered shows with family and friends. But this occasion should also be recognized as a great reminder of the importance of being good stewards of our State's resources. By investing to maintain our valued assets, they can serve current and future generations for many more years to come."

With the most dynamic open floor configuration in Music City, this tradition of presenting diverse musicians continues today, thanks to the State of Tennessee, which owns the building, and TPAC, that manages the auditorium. Located south of the state capitol and in the heart of downtown Nashville, War Memorial Auditorium and its campus also have served as the site of significant military and political events. Before Legislative Plaza was constructed, rallies to send and welcome home those who served in World War II filled Capitol Boulevard. Several candidates campaigned on site, including Presidents Dwight D. Eisenhower, John F. Kennedy, Richard Nixon,

Lyndon B. Johnson, and Jimmy Carter. On September 28, 1961, Martin Luther King Jr. acknowledged Nashville's leadership in the Civil Rights movement, announcing from the War Memorial Auditorium stage that he "came to Nashville not to bring inspiration, but to gain inspiration from the great movement that has taken place in this community." Whatever the decade or style of music, hundreds of celebrity artists have performed on this stage, and War Memorial Auditorium continues to serve Nashville and the state as a premier music venue.
