


Have you heard about the exciting developments across the street from TPAC? That's what I most want to share with you today.

We are so proud of recent improvements here and so enthusiastic about upcoming plans for this important civic venue, which was dedicated in 1925 to honor the Tennesseans who served our country in World War I. You can experience its proud history in an excellent and short video on the brand new WMA website, wmarocks.com. Did you know the Grand Ole Opry performed there from 1939 to 1943 (and again following the 2010 flood)? Other celebrated artists who appeared there in the 20th century included Ray Charles, Bette Davis, Charlie Daniels, David Bowie, KISS, Willie Nelson, Waylon Jennings, Barry Manilow, Greg Allman, and hundreds more. Buddy Guy and Jonny Lang are playing March 1, 2013, in a concert billed as "One Night: Two Guitar Legends."

And then, an exclusive Nashville experience, there's The Attic Sessions, an eclectic series of short films featuring music and interviews, notable local artists among them.

In short, TPAC staff share passion for this place – the storied history, the perfect acoustics, the sheer beauty, and the tremendous potential. 



Featuring a large-scale cast of dinosaur puppets brought to life by sophisticated design and theatrical presentation and puppet mastery, these life-like dinosaur recreations connect children to paleontology in a fun and informative setting. This monster production will feature up to 14 dinosaurs on stage which children of all ages can interact with in this fun, educational and unique performance.

THE CAST & CREW

SCOTT WRIGHT - ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Scott is the Artistic Director and co-founder of Erth Visual and Physical Inc. since its inception in 1990. He trained as a dancer and choreographer in Victoria, Australia and is a multi-skilled artist incorporating puppetry (one of his greatest loves), movement, acting, aerial, stilts and pyrotechnics.

During this period, Scott has steered the company through many twists and turns, leading the company into a successful national and international touring profile. Scott has directed most of Erth's successful touring shows, seen throughout the world and worked with a large variety of professional companies and institutions, individual artists and community groups both nationally and internationally.

Scott's personal focus currently lies within the survival of indigenous folklore, exploring how ancient stories can be retrieved and presented to new audiences which takes him into remote communities throughout Australia meeting with elders, learning and developing methods in which puppetry can tell stories of ancient creatures and landscapes.

SHARON KERR - EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Sharon is a founding and core member of Erth. Originally trained as a school teacher majoring in drama, Sharon has much performance experience. Prior to helping form Erth, she spent five years in contemporary dance theatre with emphasis on improvisational movement. Puppetry became a natural extension of this. Her roles within Erth are many and varied. Contributing to creative and performance direction, Sharon continues to perform, while assisting with the construction of props and costume. Sharon has also steered the company for many years as its key administrator. Some of her performance highlights include her aerial harness and flying work, effectively becoming a human marionette. Memorable amongst these are from atop the sails of the Sydney Opera House, the spire of St. Paul's Cathedral in Melbourne, the tower of Bingham Hall at Yale University and from the 30th floor of the Nge Ann skyscraper in Singapore.

ANNA YOUNG - GENERAL MANAGER

Anna has been in the entertainment industry all her working life. She has applied her skills and extensive experience of the arts and cultural production to events both across Australia and internationally. These range from music and film to roles from performer to producer. Her flair for production and management has seen her do the same for "Spiegelworld" both in Las Vegas and NYC (2008-2009) while also delivering the annual Australian 'G'day USA' Australia Plays Broadway concert event at Carnegie Hall (2009). Anna has been with Erth since the beginning of 2011 and has become an invaluable family member helping the company grow further and develop new markets. When people enquire as to her line of work, Anna enjoys the reply, "I manage Erth".

STEVE HOWARTH - DESIGNER

As a founding and full time member of Erth, Steve designs for most of the company's productions and

external commissions. From the Erth Studio/Workshop he supervises a team of artists in the creation of the puppets, sets, props, costumes and associated elements that constantly tour the nation and the globe. In this principle role over the last twenty years, he has worked with a wide variety of people, organisations and across numerous media.

Steve spent the first 15 years performing, in, on and dangling from many of those creations but now devotes his time solely to their realisation rather than being the one on stage. Off stage, he oversees the daily production of giant, teeth gnashing dinosaurs and inflatable monsters that live alongside traditional fine arts and textiles work and increasingly, disciplines such as digital animation.

He recently directed his first work which combined live actors, puppets, and projection. Working closely with indigenous storytellers, Taniwha! wove together threads of Maori folklore for Auckland Museum, NZ.

Steve also mentors design students from several tertiary institutions and assists emerging artists in the implementation of their respective crafts.

PHIL DOWNING – SOUND/LIGHTING/VIDEO DESIGNER
Phil has a distinct history working with interactive
multimedia. After years spent performing music, Phil set
about reinventing his means of expression through music,
by creating unique and obscure musical instruments.
This inspiration has led to the creation of numerous
soundtracks for theatrical productions. (1999-2012)

Delivery of video and imagery being an obvious progression, Phil has also worked with various technologies to incorporate physical interaction (with performers and audience members) into installations and performances. Utilizing technologies such as infra-red, sonar and pressure sensors, Arduino programmable circuit boards and "Kinect" sensors.

Working with Erth, Phil has developed systems for automated delivery of sound, light and visual effects, as well as designing stand alone sound systems for Erth's various creature puppets.

SAMANTHA HICKEY - PRESENTER / PUPPETEER Samantha has studied Acting at The Actors College of Theatre and Television in Sydney and The Stella Adler Studio in New York. She has trained and worked with ERTH Visual and Physical Inc. for over two years as a presenter, puppeteer and physical theatre performer touring around Australia and internationally. Samantha is also part of a small theatre company Umbrella Theatre and has performed, written and developed shows that have been presented at numerous festivals and events in Sydney. Samantha's theatre credits include Dinosaur Petting Zoo (Erth); Spirit Creatures (Erth); Taming the Dragon (Erth); Captain my Captain (Umbrella Theatre); Save Me (Umbrella Theatre); Black Water and Aerobic Blues (Independent productions).

THE CAST & CREW

SAM HAYES - (HERO) PUPPETEER

In a previous life Sam Hayes represented Australia as a Rugby Union footballer at junior and schoolboy levels. These days he gets his kicks from chasing children around whilst dressed as a T-Rex or an Australovenator dinosaur. Sam believes that working for Erth is like rugby, a contact sport. However, he also understands that whilst participating in the sport of dinosaur roving, the odds are stacked severely in his favour because he is, ostensibly, a 5-ton prehistoric predator and his opposition are unarmed and rarely over the age of 10. Sam never made it as a professional footballer, so he relishes the opportunity to "...get paid to do some damage" in another field. Under the alias of 'Chocko the juvenile T-Rex', Sam is particularly fond of devouring children who call him a puppet or who tell him his legs look fake. So you've been warned! Sam studied Cultural Studies and Education at Macquarie University. He has toured with Dinosaur Petting Zoo since 2010 throughout the world and most recently in the USA.

RAWIRI JOBE - PRESENTER / PUPPETEER

Since Rawiri graduated from Victoria University of Wellington in 2008, he has worked consistently as an actor and performer in the New Zealand theatre and television industries. Erth and Rawiri met during the creation of multi award winning production Hear to See with Wellington based company Capital E National Theatre for Children. Since they have worked on various projects together including Taniwha devised and created for Auckland Museum and a tour of South Australia and Queensland with Dinosaur Petting Zoo. Having never been to the US, Rawiri is excited at the prospect of enlightening millions of Americans that New Zealand isn't just a group of islands off the coast of Australia!

TIERNEY ST. JOHN - PUPPETEER

Tierney St. John was born and raised just outside of New York City. She received Bachelor of Arts degrees in Dance and Sociology from Tulane University in New Orleans. Tierney has performed and choreographed for DanceWorks and Co. (New Jersey), Newcomb Dance Company (New Orleans), TsunamiDance Company (New Orleans), and First Physical Theatre Company (South Africa.)
