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


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
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
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From Darkness to Sight



From Darkness to Sight chronicles the remarkable life journey of Dr. Ming Wang, a world-renowned laser eye surgeon and philanthropist.

As a teenager, Ming fought valiantly to escape one of history's darkest eras - China's Cultural Revolution - during which millions of innocent youth were deported to remote areas to face a life sentence of poverty and hard labor. Through his own tenacity and his parents' tireless efforts to provide a chance of freedom for their son, Ming eventually made his way to America with \$50 in his pocket and an American dream in his heart, where against all odds he would earn a PhD in laser physics and graduate magna cum laude with the highest honors from Harvard Medical School and MIT. He embraced his Christian faith and tackled one of the most important questions of our time - Are faith and science friends or foes? - which led to his invention of a breakthrough biotechnology to restore sight.

55,000 eye procedures and has treated patients from nearly every state in the U.S. and from over 55 countries worldwide. He is considered the "doctor's doctor," as he has operated on over 4,000 physicians. Dr. Wang has published 8 textbooks and a paper in the world-renowned journal Nature, holds several U.S. patents and performed the world's first laser artificial cornea implantation. He is the recipient of the Honor

Award from American Academy of Ophthalmology and the Lifetime Achievement Award from American Chinese Physician Association. Dr. Wang is currently the only surgeon in the

state who performs 3D LASIK (18+), 3D Forever Young Lens Surgery (45+), 3D Laser Kamra (45+) and 3D Laser Cataract Surgery (60+). Dr. Wang established a non-profit foundation which provides sight restoration surgeries for indigent patients who otherwise would never have the opportunity to receive them free-of-charge.

This is a story of one man's inspirational journey, of turning fear, poverty, persecution and prejudice into healing and love for others. It demonstrates how focus, determination, humility and profound faith can inspire a life that, in turn, impacts that of countless others.

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

Q&A WITH NFL LEGEND EDDIE GEORGE, TPAC'S ARTS EDUCATION ADVOCATE

The nonprofit Tennessee Performing Arts Center (TPAC) announced in December that NFL legend, former Tennessee Titan, actor, and entrepreneur Eddie George will serve as an advocate for TPAC Education.

Millions know George as a record-setting superstar who distinguished himself at The Ohio State University, where he won the Heisman Trophy, for the Tennessee Titans, and within the National Football League. Nashville audiences also know his work as an actor including Amun Ra Theatre's God's Trombones, the title roles in Julius Caesar and Othello for Nashville Shakespeare Theatre, and Nashville Repertory Theatre's The Whipping Man. He now is performing in New York as "Billy Flynn" in the Broadway musical Chicago.

George received TPAC's highest honor, The Applause Award, in 2014 for his distinguished contributions to the arts and the community. The following summer, he joined the TPAC Board of Directors. In this Q&A, George talks about his commitment to increasing awareness of the need for arts education and its positive impact on educational achievement and well-being.

Q: Why are you tackling this new role for TPAC Education?

Eddie George: I saw this as a great opportunity to share my story. The arts have been a huge part of my life. I grew up going to plays with my mother. She put me in ballet lessons. I was very reluctant in doing so, but I took ballet again in college to help with my athleticism on the field. And now after playing the game, I've found a new career and peace in doing theatre. I really want to inspire children to delve into the arts because there is so much to explore about yourself, what you can become, what you can do, and how you can express your artistic talents.

Q: What messages do you want to relay to parents and children, along with educators and arts supporters?

EG: The arts are about aligning yourself with what you want to do and your passions. They are about not being afraid and fighting through the fear or doubt over what people may say. For me, going into theatre was a no brainer. It was a great challenge, and I've enjoyed really getting to know who I am. It was a spiritual journey for me, and it still is. To be able to tell the truth in imaginary settings through various writings and different characters resonated with me. I think kids should be able to explore that, and to not be afraid of it. We often see that kids shy away from theatre or public speaking.

I want young people to see all things are possible. I was inspired by the story of Paul Robeson and how he was able to transform his life from an athlete, learning how to read and write at a late age, to become a great orator, an opera singer, and a civil rights activist. It wasn't one thing that he was. I'm not that either. I'm not going to pin myself down as an actor or as a football player or as an entrepreneur. I can do all things. I bring that same amount of integrity, passion, and focus into everything that I do, whether it's reading a book to children, or reading a play, or giving a presentation to potential clients for my business. So, I would say to kids, 'Don't think outside the box. Eliminate the box.' Then, they will learn to be comfortable in the uncomfortable and they will find their authentic voice.

Q: How do you hope to inspire children through the arts?

EG: Hopefully, I can inspire them to pursue their dreams. Every time I get on the stage I come alive. It's a funny thing. Hopefully, I can inspire kids to become whatever they want to be. The great thing about being an actor is that you have a chance to experience almost every occupation, whether it's a lawyer, a general, a servant, or a president. Whatever that may be, you have a chance to experience that on stage, and that may inspire you to become our next president, or an athlete. That's the beauty of being an actor. You can be anything you want to be.
