



TPAC Gala provides critical funding for TPAC's expansive work in arts education, a variety of programs that expose students to world class performances, aid teachers with valuable resources and training, send teaching artists into classrooms, to improve learning, and more.

Gower Elementary teacher and 2018 TPAC Teacher of the Year Miya Robertson shared her first-hand account of how TPAC empowers teachers, encourages students, and enriches the community.

"Whether on stage or in the classroom, TPAC creates moments every day in which audiences are transported to incredible places and student learning is transformed by the arts," Cody said. "I'm honored to accept the Applause Award, and I look forward to new opportunities to assist TPAC."



Who's Who in the Cast

JOHN O'HURLEY (Mr. Darling / Captain Hook) is best known as I. Peterman on "Seinfeld," the #1 syndicated television show in the world, for which he won a Screen Actor's Guild Award. He was also seen on the ABC hit "Dancing with the Stars," ABC's "Dance-Off!" and as the host of "Family Feud." He is one of the most recognizable voices on TV, appearing in dozens of animated productions including Nickelodeon's "SpongeBob SquarePants" and NBC's "Father of the Pride." O'Hurley's first CD, Peace of Our Minds, a collaboration of his piano compositions with worldrenowned cellist Marston Smith, debuted #13 on Billboard. His stage credits include starring roles in the national tours of Chicago, Spamalot, Pirates of Penzance, Gentlemen Prefer Blondes and Brigadoon. He is a New York Times bestselling author with three titles, including The Perfect Dog, which is becoming a stage musical. Most recently, John has recurring on the Lifetime series "Devious Maids", opposite Susan Lucci.

GARRETT CLAYTON (Peter Pan) is best known for his leading role in the hit Disney Channel movies "Teen Beach Movie," and "Teen Beach Movie 2." Clayton starred as Tanner, the sun-bleached surf star of a classic teen beach movie "Wet Side Story," where two kids from the present find themselves mysteriously trapped. He recently made a dramatic shift to take the lead role opposite James Franco and Christian Slater in "King Cobra", which premiered at the Tribeca Film Festival in 2016. Following that he took the lead in the thriller, "Don't Hang Up "and joined the all-star cast of Harvey Fierstein, Jennifer Hudson, Ariana Grande, Kristin Chenoweth and Martin Short for NBC's "Hairspray Live!" He recently finished up work on the drama, "Reach", which will be released in 2018. Clayton has also recently found his way back to the stage, starring opposite Al Pacino and Judith Light in God Looked Away. The show premiered at the Pasadena Playhouse and is expected to make its way to Broadway later this year. He is currently working on a musical version of the popular film "The Breakfast Club", which will open summer 2017. Past work includes a lead role in the musical version of Almost Famous. An actor, singer and dancer, his television credits include a recurring role on the hit ABC Family series "The Fosters," and guest-star roles on series such as Lifetime's "The Client List," and Disney Channel's "Shake It Up" and "Jessie." Clayton also led a talented cast in the Lifetime TV movie "Holiday Spin," opposite Ralph Macchio. Raised in the suburbs of Detroit, Michigan, Clayton performed in regional theater productions of "High School Musical 2," "You're a Good Man Charlie Brown," "Peter Pan" and "Beauty and the Beast."

DIANA DEGARMO (*Tinker Bell*). For over the last decade, Diana DeGarmo has been blowing away audiences with her powerful voice and irresistible charm. Fans first grew to love Diana on the cultural phenomenon, "American Idol" where she placed second at the mere age of 16. Shortly after, Diana released her first single "Dreams" that reached #1 on the Billboard Hot 100 Singles Chart. She made her Broadway debut at only 18 in the role of Penny Pingleton in *Hairspray*, solidifying her spot amongst

the Broadway Divas. Her comedy chops and big voice brought down the house again in the Off Broadway cult hit, The Toxic Avenger as Sarah the blonde, blind, librarian. Splitting her time between her beloved home in Nashville and the rest of the world, Diana made a name for herself on the #1 Daytime TV Drama, "The Young And The Restless", creating the vivacious and wild character, Angelina. While in Los Angeles, Diana revised her beloved role as Penny Pingleton in Hairspray at the Hollywood Bowl starring Drew Carey and Corbin Bleu. All the while releasing two of her own EPs, "Unplugged in Nashville" and "Live to Love" that included the hit song "Good Goodbye" that was showcased during her reign on "The Young And The Restless". In 2010, she joined the Broadway revival of "Hair" where she met now husband, Ace Young. Soon the two became a dynamic duo writing and singing songs for TV Shows and Films and touring together in Joseph And The Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat and multiple times with the USO. Diana has also taken her talents on the road with the First National Broadway Tours of Bkyln: The Musical and 9 to 5, where she was handpicked to play Doralee by the one and only Dolly Parton herself! She recently returned home to Nashville from touring South Korea while starring as Lucy in Jekyll & Hyde alongside Kyle Dean Massey. Diana just shot the pilot "Melange" and will next be seen starring in Jekyll & Hyde at North Shore Music Theatre. She was an active actor as a child growing up in Georgia, but her most recent films include "Alto", "After The Sun Fell And The First Ride Of Wyatt Earp". To hear Diana at her finest, download & stream her new EP "GEMINI - Volume 1" on your favorite online music player. "GEMINI - Volumes 2 & 3" will be gracing you soon! Diana is a one-of-akind entertainer who has always wanted her career to not be just a shooting star but an entire galaxy. She is honored to be a part of the Headline Talent Agency family and a proud member of the Actor's Equity Association and SAG-AFTRA.

TEGAN MARIE (Wendy) With a larger-than-life voice, Tegan Marie, 14, was discovered by girls' media platform Sweety High when her family started uploading her videos at age 7. Featured as a Radio Disney Country artist, she catapulted into the national spotlight when her breathtaking rendition of Florida Georgia Line's "H.O.L.Y." received over 20M views online. Tegan Marie went on to a string of acclaimed performances at Stagecoach, ABC's Good Morning America, the Grand Ole Opry and PBS' The Gershwin Prizespecial honoring Smokey Robinson. As her videos continue to gain a wide audience (over 100M views), Tegan Marie has shared the stage with artists such as Cam, Hunter Hayes and Kelsea Ballerini while partnering with Pepsi for a tour across the Midwest. In 2017, she became the youngest female artist - at age 13 - signed to a major Country label (Warner Music Nashville) in over 45 years. She has since made her debut at the Ryman Auditorium, played the TODAY show and was featured on the 2018 watch lists for Billboard, Rolling Stone and Huffington Post. Following the release her new

song, "I Know How To Make A Boy Cry," she's in the studio working on new music with hitmakers Scott Hendricks (Blake Shelton) and Nathan Chapman (Taylor Swift).
