# Arts Education in Action

A nationally respected model, TPAC Education serves adults and children of all ages, from pre-school to high school. One program, sponsored by Bank of America, will serve approximately 1,000 pre-school children in 54 Head Start classrooms in Metro Nashville this year.

TPAC's Wolf Trap Early Learning Through the Arts partners professional artists with pre-school teachers to advance early childhood learning and development with music, theatre, storytelling, dance, and puppetry. Children take part in fun arts activities that strengthen problem-solving, expression, confidence, enthusiasm for learning, and more. Teachers discover new educational tools to engage students and enhance instruction.

"What we do through the arts, in my case percussion, is to teach fundamental literacy skills and life skills," said percussionist Dann Sherrill, one of six Wolf Trap artists who is specially trained to work in Head Start classrooms this school year.

"The children are always very enthusiastic and excited to see us when we come in. We develop quite a bond with the children and teachers over the six weeks that we work with them. The activities I lead tend to include percussion instruments, and range from basic playful rhythm explorations to interactive storytelling about the adventures of my big conga drum. The structure and content are geared to helping children expand their senses, relate to other people, and develop emerging literacy skills—what you need to learn a language," said Sherrill, noting that language has its own rhythm, which makes percussion the ideal instrument to help children master English before they learn to read. His activities accent the emphasis, tone and cadence of the language which are vital to preparing children to read.

Sherrill is a percussionist and drum set player from Nashville who plays Afro-Cuban and Brazilian Percussion, playing regularly with salsa dance orchestras. As a session drummer/percussionist, he has recorded numerous CDs with a range of artists including Steve Winwood, Michael English, Engelbert Humperdinck, Mel Tillis, Bonnie Bramlett, Armando Perazza, Arturo Sandoval, Hayseed Dixie, Mark Selby, Jamie O'Hara, and Alvin Slaughter. He teaches ensemble classes at the Nashville Jazz Workshop, has

"Our Wolf Trap Artist has brought to our center a richness that these children have never experienced," said Head Start teacher Vicky Collins about another one of the TPAC teaching artists. "She brings the world of ethnicity in song and dance and has helped the children to have an appreciation for the earth, community and each other."

a thriving private teaching practice, and conducts workshops, classes, clinics and performances at schools, universities, and community organizations.

"It's energizing to be around people that age. If you have your game on, the children participate gladly and put their hearts and souls into it," said Sherrill, who sees the impact of his time in each classroom. "I can think of children who were complete wallflowers before the lessons. At the conclusion of the residency, they came out of their shells, participating more in class activities and expressing themselves better.... It works. I just hope that it continues. No question, the program is worthwhile and valid. Working with children through the arts is another arrow in the quiver that is necessary to help children grow and learn in challenging environments."





#### THE RIVERDANCE IRISH DANCE TROUPE

Many of the *Riverdance* Irish Dance Troupe are World Champion Irish Dancers. The troupe hails mostly from Ireland, but also from Great Britain, the United States, Canada and Australia. Between them, the dancers can boast of literally hundreds of championships won in Ireland and abroad. All started dancing at three or four years of age at local dance schools and progressed to World Championship level before being chosen to perform in *Riverdance*. The dancers would have known and competed against each other at various competitions, including the World Championships. *Riverdance* has given them the opportunity to perform together for the first time in a non-competitive way. The grace and eloquence of their soft-shoe dance, the power and precision of their hard shoe routines clearly display the endless hours of practice and their dedication to the art of Irish Dance.

#### THE RIVERDANCE BAND

The exciting developments and cross-cultural fusion that have taken place in Irish music in recent years is reflected vividly in the multi-talents of the *Riverdance* Band. Their schooling and wealth of experience would seem to have destined them for a key part in this production. They play a blend of instruments which, in ensemble and in solo passages, complement perfectly the visual excitements on-stage. The breadth and scope of Bill Whelan's music for *Riverdance* presents a challenge – but it's one for which they are well equipped. As individual performers they are in constant demand, their talents have made them much sought-after as accompanists as well as on stage and in television and recording studios world-wide. They now bring this wealth of experience to *Riverdance*.

#### THE RIVERDANCE SINGERS

The haunting, beautiful voices of the *Riverdance* Singers are closely interwoven with all the other elements of the show, their harmonies and solo passages bringing echoes of an ancient mysticism. The singers come from many backgrounds and are all high achievers in their own right. Most of them also have other professional qualifications far removed from the stage. But all have one thing in common – a love of Irish music and an urge to bring it to a world audience in the wonderful new guise showcased in this unique production.

**BILL WHELAN** (*Composer*) Bill has worked extensively in theatre and film. He was appointed composer to the W.B. Yeats International Theatre Festival at Ireland's National Abbey Theatre in 1989, writing original music for 15 Yeats plays. His adaptation of HMS Pinafore received a Laurence Olivier Award nomination. His compositional work in film includes original scores for Dancing At Lughnasa starring Meryl Streep, Some Mother's Son starring Helen Mirren and Lamb starring Liam Neeson. Music for television includes *The Seven Ages*, Sean Ó Mordha's history of the Irish State. The Seville Suite was his first large scale orchestral work, commissioned for Ireland's National Day at Expo '92 in Seville. The Spirit Of Mayo followed in 1993. Bill recently completed a trilogy of pieces for chamber orchestra: Inishlacken, which has been performed in Europe and the US; Carna, which premiered in Carnegie Hall in March 2005 and Errisbeg, which received its world premiere in December 2005. All three works are included on Bill Whelan's latest CD, The Connemara Suite released in December 2007. His many production and arranging credits include U2, Van Morrison, Kate Bush, Richard Harris and Planxty. He has written and recorded a new composition with the classical violinist Vanessa-Mae, and is currently writing a new theatre work which has been commissioned by the New York Metropolitan Opera and Lincoln Center. Bill was honored with the 1997 Grammy Award for

"Best Musical Show Album" for his *Riverdance* CD. The album is a certified Platinum record in the US, Ireland and Australia. Bill holds two honorary Doctorates and has just been awarded a fellowship by the Royal Irish Academy of Music. He is a member of the Boards of Berklee School of Music in Boston, The University of Limerick, and the board of the Irish contemporary music "*Crash*" Ensemble.

MOYA DOHERTY (Producer) Moya Doherty's career includes theatre, radio and television production, both in Ireland and internationally. Moya is the Producer of Riverdance, the worldwide acclaimed theatrical phenomenon. Moya is a director of Tyrone Productions, Ireland's leading independent television production company, whose output includes drama, documentary and entertainment programming. She was a founding Director of Today FM, Ireland's national independent radio station, she is a former Chair of the Dublin International Theatre Festival and served on its Board for seven years. Moya produced, with John McColgan, Boublil & Schönberg's musical The Pirate Queen which premiered on Broadway in the spring of 2007. Moya and John are currently producing, and are involved in, a diverse range of projects for the Irish and international stage. Moya has won many awards and accolades over the years. She was named the Veuve Clicquot Business Woman of the Year, received the Ernst & Young Entrepreneur of the Year Award and has been bestowed with Honorary Doctorates from the University of Ulster & from the National University of Ireland in recognition of her ongoing commitment to the world of the arts in Ireland.

**JOHN McCOLGAN** (*Director*) John McColgan's career as a highly successful television director began in the mid seventies in RTÉ Television, Ireland's national television service, where he went on to become Head of Entertainment. While in RTÉ John produced and directed an impressive range of top quality programmes, from drama to documentaries. He is a founding Director of Tyrone Productions, Ireland's premier independent television production company and is Chairman of Today FM radio station. He played a key role in the evolution of Riverdance from the original seven-minute dance number and went on to direct the full stageshow spectacular. John has been closely involved with The Abbey Theatre, Ireland's National Theatre, he was on the Board of the Theatre for five years, served as Chairman of the Abbey Centenary Committee and directed a critically acclaimed production of the 19th century melodrama, The Shaughraun, for the theatre. John produced, with Moya Doherty, Boublil & Schonberg's musical The Pirate Queen which premiered on Broadway in the spring of 2007. John McColgan and Moya Doherty are currently producing, and are involved in, a diverse range of projects for the Irish and international stage. John has received many awards during his career, including an Honorary Doctorate of Law from the National University of Ireland in recognition of his services to the arts and entertainment industry.
