

As many of you know, we manage War Memorial Auditorium (WMA), the historic monument on Legislative Plaza. We are so proud of recent improvements here and so enthusiastic about upcoming plans for this important civic venue, which was dedicated in 1925 to honor the Tennesseans who served our country in World War I. You can experience its proud history in an excellent and short video on the brand new WMA website, wmarocks.com. Did you know the Grand Ole Opry performed there from 1939 to 1943 (and again following the 2010 flood)? Other celebrated artists who appeared there in the 20th century included Ray Charles, Bette Davis, Charlie Daniels, David Bowie, KISS, Willie Nelson, Waylon Jennings, Barry Manilow, Greg Allman, and hundreds more. Buddy Guy and Jonny Lang are playing March 1, 2013, in a concert billed as "One Night: Two Guitar Legends."

And then, an exclusive Nashville experience, there's The Attic Sessions, an eclectic series of short films featuring music and interviews, notable local artists among them.

In short, TPAC staff share passion for this place – the storied history, the perfect acoustics, the sheer beauty, and the tremendous potential. As Roger LeBlanc, our new WMA talent buyer said: "The stage is big and brilliant. The acoustics are second-to-none. But what you really feel when you're in the space is that history. And the room applies that grandeur onto the performer, whatever their personality. It can do anything."

Have no doubt, history is still in the making at War Memorial Auditorium. I hope you'll be a part of the ongoing adventures.







Brandy June 8, 2013 - 7:00 p.m.



The Mississippi-born daughter of a gospel singer father, Brandy became one of the most successful multimedia stars of the '90s, thanks to her constant presence on both the pop and R&B charts, as well as star turns on the hit sitcom Moesha and the classic made-for-TV movie phenomenon *Cinderella*, which attracted more than 60 million viewers and broke new ground with its multi-cultural cast. Since emerging with her 3x-platinum self-titled debut album in 1994 (released when Brandy was 15), this trailblazing pioneer has sold more than 40 million albums worldwide (including the 5x-platinum selling *Never Say Never*) and is ranked one of the best-selling female artists in American music history by the RIAA. Her awards include top honors from a Grammy, an AMA, NAACP, *Billboard*, MTV, and BMI. Brandy also currently stars on BET's top-rated scripted series *The Game* and will appear in Tyler Perry's upcoming film *The Marriage Counselor*.

Queensryche Starring Geoff Tate June 20, 2013 - 8:00 p.m.



Queensryche vocalist and founding member Geoff Tate is taking the new Queensryche lineup on the road in celebration of the 25th anniversary of *Operation: Mindcrime*, the band's epic 1988 release. Featuring bassist Rudy Sarzo, guitarist Kelly Gray, keyboardist Randy Gane, guitarist Robert Sarzo and drummer Simon Wright, the performances will cover each song from the album in addition to other fan favorites pulled from the extended Queensryche catalog.

Queensryche first came together in Bellevue, Washington in 1981 when heavy metal was first taking off in America. *Operation: Mindcrime* is evidence of a band coming into its own: as the 1980s drew to a close, Queensryche released this concept album that

took them to new heights, placing them on a level playing field with bands like Def Leppard, Metallica, and Guns 'N Roses (each of which Queensryche toured with before the 1990s began). Throughout the 1990s and early 2000s, Queensryche continued to tour and record new music. Recently, the current lineup signed a worldwide record deal with Cleopatra Records, an independent label based in Los Angeles. In addition to the *Operation: Mindcrime* anniversary tour, Queensryche are expected to enter the studio to start recording material for their first album on the Cleopatra label.

Los Lobos, Los Lonely Boys, & Alejandro Escovedo June 22, 2013 - 7:00 p.m.

LOS LOBOS More than three decades have passed since Los Lobos released their debut album, *Just Another Band from East L.A.* Since then they've repeatedly disproven that title—Los Lobos isn't "just another" anything, but rather a band that has consistently evolved artistically while never losing sight of their humble roots.
