About Peter Gros

All Animals, All the Time. On Mutual of Omaha's *Wild Kingdom* on Animal Planet, Peter Gros provides the link between the original series, where he served as co-host, and the new specials. This ensures that the new specials remain true to the heritage of the beloved original series. Gros also was featured in the "Cheetah: Race Against Time" *Wild Kingdom* special in 2005 and "Magnificent Moments" in 2007.

The original Mutual of Omaha's *Wild Kingdom* series – a program honored with 41 major awards, including four Emmy Awards and an endorsement by the National PTA for television programming recommended for family viewing – was one of the best known and longest-running series on nature and the animal world.

Gros has been a frequent guest on LIVE with Regis and Kelly and the CBS Early Show. In addition, he has appeared on numerous talk shows, including The Tonight Show with Jay Leno.

Mr. Gros is also an active conservationist. On behalf of Mutual of Omaha, Peter Gros is intimately involved in a nationwide conservation education program conducted at the local community level. Gros' research expeditions have taken him to Lake Baikal in Siberia to explore the wonders of the world's largest, oldest and deepest lake, and to the Amazon Basin where he led an expedition of 39 sixth-graders from Zeeland, Michigan, to study the Peruvian rain forest. He also has studied the effects of ecotourism on wildlife in Venezuela, Costa Rica, Belize, Mexico, and the Galapagos Islands. In addition, Gros has served as the U.S. representative on the Citizen Ambassador Program's research study of tigers and rhinos in the Chitwan National Forest in Nepal.

In his travels throughout the world, Gros and his animal friends help teach about the importance of caring for the world around us. Peter Gros has nearly 30 years of field experience with captive wildlife. In his former position as director of land animals and vice president at Marine World/Africa USA, he established breeding programs for 377 endangered animals. He also developed a rehabilitation program for birds of prey, as well as the largest captive breeding colony of ostriches in the United States. He is a licensed Exhibition & Animal Educator for the U.S.D.A. and an active member of the American Zoo and Aquariums Association and Zoological Association of America. Gros is also on the board of directors of the Suisun Marsh Natural History Association.

He is a frequent lecturer on conservation and preservation at universities, zoos and nature and science centers around the nation. Gros currently serves as president of the Green Valley Center for Wildlife Education.

Who's Who in the Cast

WILLIAM SHATNER has cultivated a career spanning more than 50 years as an award-winning actor, director, producer, writer, recording artist and horseman. enormous success with the American Saddlebred, developing and riding world champions and winning numerous world championships in several equine events. His passions for horses and philanthropy were united when he started the Hollywood Charity Horse Show. The annual event benefits Los Angeles-based children's charities. Shatner continues to act, write, produce and direct while still making time to work with charities and further his passion for equestrian sports. He and his wife Elizabeth and three married children live in Los Angeles.

ABOUT TONIGHT

A one-man show by definition is one man. I know we are all alone in life, and as much as we try to reach out to other people, fall in love, have children and keep social contacts alive, still we are alone and we die alone. Our life is pretty much a one-man show. And yet...we mask it with our flurries of activities and meetings, and texting and jokes and gossip and Pilates, all of it to hide our essential aloneness.

But there's no masking being the only one on stage. Oh God, how I wish I had dancing girls and acrobats, and a couple of timpani would help. But then that is a four-man show. This is me, telling stories. Oh sure, a few projections here and there but hey – it could work without them. Look as hard as you can, you can't find anyone else on stage.

The material needs to be interesting, observant, piquant and hopefully amusing. There needs to be contrast and color and rhythm and tempo. You need to hold the audience's attention. The actor has no aids like plot or conflict and all the essentials of dramatic plays. The lonely performer is responsible for all that.

And what about a little anxiety?

The actor going solo has a little more apprehension than is customary. No matter how many years one is in entertainment, the constant companion is fear of failure. That, my friend, is a cruel task master.

The irony is that a one-man show doesn't come about through one man. There are many others without whom the endeavor would not exist. People like Larry Thompson, Trixstar and Mike Anderson, Spirit Works in Australia, and creative partners like Innovation Arts Entertainment. I am grateful to all of them.

SYNOPSIS: In 1960, Frank Abagnale, a young con man, is cornered in the Miami International Airport surrounded by FBI Agent Carl Hanratty and his team. He began to track down the writer of the checks, launching a cat and mouse chase across the nation.
