What's your story? How has TPAC impacted you over the years? Have you been swept away by what you've seen on stage? I invite you to share your experiences with us as we begin to collect and document stories in a new way. We are planning to launch a series – which will include short videos – to put faces on the diverse voices of TPAC.


Some of my favorite stories are told by educators and teaching artists, who see how our educational programs transform children. Just recently, one shared a success story about a boy with autism whose classroom response and interaction dramatically increased through arts activities. Especially with the changes in Tennessee education standards, we're thrilled to hear how TPAC Education is making a difference to teachers who are integrating subjects across curriculum with our methods of hands-on, project-based learning.

We also love stories about the impact of seeds sown in childhood. In 1983, Lattie Brown, a high school student, attended *The Glass Menagerie*, the very first TPAC Education performance. After working professionally as an actress, she now manages TPAC's program for pre-school children, where her many accomplishments have included producing the album *Give Yourself A High Five*, recipient of an esteemed Gold Award from Parents' Choice. Lattie is only one of many from the first generation of TPAC Education programs who have gone on to impact the quality of life, learning, and art in our state.

Then, there are Tricia and Chris Casa Santa. They met through a singles group TPAC once sponsored, getting people together for food, drink, and a Broadway show. "We happened to meet and the rest is history. We've been married for 17 years," said Chris, who shares many fond memories of TPAC experiences with Tricia. They especially appreciated titles like Miss Saigon, The Color Purple, and Twelve Angry Men for the insights they lent into American history and culture.

"At other times, a play is inspiring because it opens up your eyes to a situation you are in or will be facing some day," he said, referencing *On Golden Pond* and *Tuesdays with Morrie*. The Casa Santas also have a history of giving back to TPAC, serving as volunteers and long time Applause Society donors. In doing so, they are "paying it forward" to today's children.

The Country Music Association (CMA) Foundation has awarded an \$18,000 grant to Disney Musicals in Schools TPAC – Nashville, adding the program to its generous support for Metro Nashville Public Schools.

TPAC EDUCATION IN THE

Children learn through discovery – touching, moving, exploring, asking questions. Active and eager to learn, they use all of their senses to absorb information and make sense of the world around them. They are natural artists who love music, stories, dance, and talks with puppet friends.

The arts are thus natural links to the building blocks for young children in every subject and skill area, including science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM), along with social relations, motivation to learn, problem-solving, confidence, literacy, and more.

That's how TPAC Education's program in Metro Nashville Head Start Centers is making a profound difference and a powerful impact.

Professional performers, trained as teaching artists, bring their talents in dance, puppetry, music, storytelling and theatre into the classroom to energize learning. They work side-by-side with Head Start educators to target curriculum goals.


Children experience performing arts activities that captivate their imaginations, advance their skills, and expand their knowledge.

Educators find new tools to engage their students, enhance instruction, and encourage whole child development.

TPAC's early childhood program, Nashville Wolf Trap, is an affiliate of the internationally respected Wolf Trap Institute for Early Learning Through the Arts.

EXCELLENCE FOR CHILDREN

The Wolf Trap Institute for Early Learning Through the Arts previously received research results that **documented significant gains** in the six categories contained in a standardized assessment tool. The study followed pre-school children whose classes and teachers participated in classroom residencies with a Wolf Trap professional Teaching Artist (in blue) and control groups which did not participate in Wolf Trap.



This study was supported through major funding from the U.S. Department of Education. Douglas Klayman, Ph.D., evaluator. Children were assessed before and after Wolf Trap's Fairfax Pages program implementation using the standardized, national validated Child Observation Record (COR), an observational assessment tool designed by High/Scope Educational Research Foundation and implemented in Fairfax County public schools and early childhood programs administered by the Office for Children. Using data from the COR assessment, the graph above illustrates the comparison of students in the Pages program and those who did not participate.

PRE-SCHOOL CLASSROOM

The Institute was created by Wolf Trap Foundation for the Performing Arts (WolfTrap.org) in 1981 to provide arts-integrated teaching strategies to early childhood educators and direct services to children. The following year, the TPAC Education program in Metro Nashville Head Start Centers began as its first national affiliate.

Now, Wolf Trap is on the cutting edge of two national priorities: STEM learning and early childhood education.

As a proven leader in early childhood learning, Wolf Trap was selected for a STEM project of immense proportions, funded by a grant from the U.S. Department of Education and corporate partners.

Early Childhood STEM Learning Through the Arts (Early STEM/Arts) specifically focuses on math learning as the foundation for all STEM skills development. According to a study by Northwestern University, math skills are the strongest predictor of later school achievement. In early childhood, math content areas include counting, recognizing numerals, patterns and shapes, spatial awareness, measurement, comparisons, and data collection.

Following a pilot program in Fairfax County, Virginia, Wolf Trap Teaching Artists are implementing the STEM model to improve math learning in pre-school classrooms nationwide, including Nashville Head Start Centers.

TPAC PARTNERS WITH MUSEUM ON WWI EXHIBIT

War Horse, the final offering in the 2013-14 series of HCA/TriStar Health Broadway at TPAC, explores the deep bond between a boy and his horse who are separated by World War I.

Enhance your experience of this incredible show with a visit to an exhibit at TPAC, created in partnership with the Tennessee State Museum. The striking display of artifacts, photographs, art, and video is on the G Level, directly below the main Jackson Lobby.

In 2006, the CMA Artist Relations Committee established the Keep the Music Playing program to give back to the community on behalf of the hundreds of country artists who perform and make appearances for free at CMA Music Festival each year.

The announcement of the 2013 CMA Music Festival donation was made at a reception prior to the Fifth Annual CMA Keep the Music Playing All Stars Concert at the new CMA Theater at the Country Music Hall of Fame and Museum. The All Stars Concert honors exemplary elementary, middle, and high school performance groups selected from the district.

CMA Awards nominee and EMI Records Nashville recording artist Eric Paslay hosted the concert and was on hand for the donation announcement. In his remarks, Paslay noted how musical theatre was an important influence in his childhood along with the teachers "who pushed him out onto the stage of life" through arts experiences.

"This program wouldn't even exist without the country music artists who make this gift possible," said Joe Galante, chairman of The CMA Foundation Board of Directors. "With the right tools and instruction from our music educators, we've witnessed firsthand the impact of the Keep the Music Playing program on students' academic success. The results are impressive."
