## ***Word From AF Pro-tem 2006***

### **Winston**

Dear AF'ers,

We thank the Lord for His grace and mercy, and for His love in preserving us. It is almost a year since Truth BP Church was formed. It is also almost a year since Truth Adults' Fellowship (TAF) was formed. One year and three months ago, who would have thought that God would raise up a church? Yet God did exactly that, yea, and more. We thank God that right at the beginning, the fellowship groups of YF, YAF and AF have been established.

The initial plan was to have a combined YAF and AF under TAF, as we were still new and our numbers were still small. But God showed us our lack of faith and changed our plans. Thus, YAF and TAF were formed separately. We thank God for the first meeting on 6<sup>th</sup> January 2006, which was combined with YAF. Dr Tow, our supervisory pastor, expounded on our motto, "To Live Is Christ, To Die Is Gain", taken from Philippians 1:21.

"To Live Is Christ, To Die Is Gain" – this is an appropriate motto for adults in this generation. Many adults – Christian adults – are blinded by the attractions of the world, and are caught up in the rat race, striving for academic and economic excellence and achievements at the expense of Christ and things spiritual. The motto reminds us of the purpose of our living and the hope that we have when we die. This helps us to refocus our attention and efforts towards spiritual things, to strive for things eternal, and to "lay up for [ourselves] treasures in heaven", "for where your treasure is, there will your heart be also" (Matthew 6:20,21).

As we reflect on what the Lord has done for us, we cannot help but marvel at how His Hand has led us each step of the way. We are reminded of how the Israelites crossed over River Jordan into the Promised Land by a miraculous parting of the waters as recorded in Joshua 3 and 4. After all the people were clean passed over Jordan, twelve men went back into the centre of the riverbed and carried twelve stones, each representing one tribe, over to Gilgal, where a memorial was set up with the stones. The purpose of this was to remind the people of what the Lord has done for them, in parting the waters of Jordan for them to cross, just as He also did, the waters of the Red Sea for them to escape Egypt. It serves as an object lesson for future generations of Israelites when they shall ask, "What mean these stones?" May Truth BP Church be such a memorial. May TAF be such a memorial.

The programme of TAF is planned to edify and educate us in the things of God. We thank God for many good speakers this year. We also thank God for the good fellowship and the food fellowship that we have. However, more adults can benefit from this programme and fellowship. Let us invite more adults to join the TAF.

The first year is almost over. The TAF has taken its first step. The period of infancy is over. The road ahead may be difficult and fraught with problems. But we know that with God's Hand leading and guiding us, the TAF will continue to grow and to serve the adults of Truth BP Church.

Dear AF'ers,

Greetings in the precious Name of our soon-returning Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

It is that time of year again to review and report the events of the AF in 2006, and at the same time, to plan for the coming year.

Thank God for seeing the AF through its first year, a year that was transitional in some respects. The make-up of the membership, different foci (at times) and types of programs are symptomatic of the transition we faced. However, some things did remain the same, like the group system, meeting twice a month; and yes, we also managed some new projects and activities, like regular verse memorization (ably conducted by Martin), combined fellowship meetings every fifth Saturday, and not forgetting participating as a fellowship in the first ever Church Quiz!

On a personal note, I like to thank my group members who have helped in many ways in the AF, especially in the chairing of meetings. So "Thank You" to: Winston, Soh Han, Mary, Choon Leong & Jen.

Looking ahead, on a broader perspective, I have two wishes for the AF in 2007.

### **1) A Greater Fellowship**

In June, we had our first Truth BPC Camp at Mersing, and our camp theme was, "Blest Be The Tie That Binds." Dr. Jeffrey Khoo, our main camp speaker, reminded us of the basis of our fellowship, our ties, firstly with God, and subsequently, with one another, in quoting *1 John 1:3* – *that which we have seen and heard declare we unto you, that ye also may have fellowship with us: and truly our fellowship is with the Father, and with his Son Jesus Christ.* ", and verse 7, *"But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin."*

Most of us are also familiar with *Hebrews 10:25*, *"Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as the manner of some is; but exhorting one another: and so much the more, as ye see the day approaching."* Much has already been expounded about fellowship from this verse. However, for the benefit of some who remain unconvinced of the need and merits of assembling ourselves together, I would like to raise another point for our consideration in this matter. At the same time, may this serve as a good reminder to AF'ers of the high privilege and blessing we have when we spend time in fellowship with one another, in obedience to the Lord.

In the account of our Lord Jesus Christ's washing of the disciples' feet in John 13, apart from the oft-mentioned lesson in humility exemplified by our Lord, it also teaches us the need to always come to the Savior for our spiritual cleansing. As we walked through this sin-filled world daily, our hearts and minds become stained with, and weighed down by the sins of our flesh: sins we need to be purged of, if we are to remain closely connected to God.

AF meetings are truly God-sent, and a very good avenue for us to come into the presence of God, to hear and to be sanctified by His word (Jn 17:17). Each time we listen to the preaching of God's word we are sanctified by His Truth. When we meditate upon His word, sing and pray to God, the process of sanctification and cleansing takes place. Do we not need to be sanctified daily, and often? We should not miss such opportunities to be washed and made whole again by our Master, to renew our worship and praise of Him. If our Lord does not wash us, He says we have no part with Him (Jn 13:8). So may we not despise nor neglect the gathering together in fellowship (and in this respect, other activities like prayer meeting, family worship, bible

study, e-band, etc.), but as we realize the need and the many benefits of assembling ourselves together in His Name, let us truly love and honor God by obeying Him.

## **2) The 3 'E's: Exaltation, Edification, and Evangelism**

It is also my hope and prayer that AF'ers will continue to grow spiritually and to mature in the faith in the following areas: a) in exalting God more and more in our lives, b) to be edified and to edify others, so that we may all be brought to a closer walk with Him and c) to be more engaged in self-less service for the Lord, especially in the work of personal and organized evangelism.

We need to pray hard for grace and wisdom from the Lord, to direct and guide us so that we may be able to come up with the right activities and programmes, in order to achieve these spiritual goals. Let everyone do a part, big or small, so that the AF may be a good testimony to the grace and mercy of our Lord.

To conclude, following God is not easy, but not to follow after Him is not an option.

The Lord Jesus, in *Luke 9:23* proclaimed that *"If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me."* Paul, the apostle, beseeched believers *"to present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service. And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God."* (Rom 12:1-2).

Discipleship is for all believers; no believer is excused from this duty, none is excluded. Discipleship involves a deliberate choice, a definite denial of self, and an unwavering determination to obey God. It is about making a very conscientious and deliberate decision to commit and submit to God, and to work tirelessly at this commitment. No believer is to call God, "Lord, Lord" and do not the things, which God says to him or her (Matt 7:21). How very "hard" then it is to be a Christian! It certainly goes against the very grain of contemporary and popular mindsets and sinful devises of our time: Of easy believe-ism and a 'me-centered' decision, instead of a God-centered, and a God-honoring faith. But we can, and we need to take heart, for His grace is sufficient for us (2 Cor 12:9) and "He is faithful that promised" (Heb 10:23).

Thank God we are saved, but we are not to stop here. We are to live a consecrated life, completely dedicated to God, and to keep ourselves *"in the love of God, looking for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ unto eternal life"* (Jude 21). Before we teach all nations, to observe all things whatsoever the Lord has commanded us (Matt 28:19-20), we need first of all, to be willing and good disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ.

May the Holy Spirit rekindle in us a new, godly desire to follow the Lord, wholly consecrated and dedicated to Him in 2007; may new, godly habits replace old, childish ways, so that we may truly say that *"for me to live is Christ, and to die is gain"* (Phil 1:21)!

*"Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things."* (Phil 4:8).

## Highlights of Activities 2006 by Winston

The first was on 29<sup>th</sup> Apr: “Joining the Rat Race – Is My Plan Part of God’s Will?” The focus was on having the right perspective towards work and career. Rev Jack Sin spoke, and Rev and Mrs Jack Sin, and Pr Dennis Kwok were the forum speakers. The games and discussions also brought us closer together.

The second was during the church camp, “Love is Blind; Marriage is an Eye-Opener”, with Rev Lee Kim Shong as the speaker. There was also a forum with Rev Jeffrey Khoo, Rev Lee, Mr and Mrs John Loo on the panel. The third was on 29<sup>th</sup> July, with the theme “Communication in the Family”. Elder Sim Siang Kok was the speaker. There were case studies and discussions and a forum with Elder Sim, Elder Tan Nee Keng and Mrs Josephine Loo on the panel. The last Combined Fellowship Meeting is scheduled for 30<sup>th</sup> Dec, with the theme on money: “What Do I Do With The Other 90%?” Elder Seah will be the speaker.

The programme for AF started with a series on “Our Relationship To God” for the first quarter, followed by “Our Relationship To the World”. From Aug to Dec, the focus was on “The Christian – Church History and Theology”. We thank God for providing very good speakers who taught us faithfully from the Word of God, including Dr Jeffrey Khoo, Rev Quek Suan Yew, Rev Prabhudas Koshy, Rev Jack Sin, Rev Kiantoro, Pr Dennis Kwok, Bro Dominino and Mr John Loo.
